Poletti Associates Inc. of Woodside was recently named one of the top 50 women-owned businesses in Silicon Valley. And it isn't the first time. "We've been named several times," says Sue Poletti, owner and president.

Poletti Associates Inc. is a furniture dealership providing furnishings, space planning and interior design to corporate and residential clients.

The ranking of women-owned businesses is established each year by the Silicon Valley/San Jose Business Journal and is based on fiscal-year revenue. "Through the years our revenue has varied from \$3 million to \$9 million," says Ms. Poletti.

Among the company's clients are venture capitalists, software companies and health-care providers. Poletti Associates has designed and furnished lobbies, private offices, cubicles, even cafeterias.

"Years ago our company did all the common areas of Woodside Terrace in Redwood City," says Ms. Poletti.

The company can supply products from auditorium seating to warehouse shelving.

Ms. Poletti is also currently working with architects on three large residential remodeling projects in Woodside.

"Most of our clients come from referrals," says

Ms. Poletti, who has been in business since 1984. She and her team work out of stylish offices at 1590 Canada Road in Woodside. Longtime residents will remember the building as the former home of the Country Almanac (now The Almanac).

Today's handsome interior is a far cry from the jumble of used desks and shabby carpeting it sported in Almanac days. Walls are a rich gold with creamy wainscoting and crown molding. Plantation shutters grace the windows.

Ms. Poletti's office is a study in gold and blue with a bouquet of fresh flowers and tasteful landscapes. Outside is a flagstone terrace complete with fountain.

Ms. Poletti gives designer Robert Miller of Miller/Dolezal Design credit for colors used on the building's interior and exterior, and installation of the fountain. Mr. Miller was a tenant of the building for eight years before moving his offices to Portola Valley.

Today the building is shared by Poletti Associates and Del Gavio Group. Twenty-two years ago Ms. Poletti and Pat Del Gavio worked together for a company selling office furnishings. When their commissions were slashed, they decided to go out

on their own and founded Corporate Environments. Twelve years ago they bought the building at 1590 Canada Lane.

The women started out with a handshake and an

agreement they would put off having children for three years in order to get their new company on its feet.

"I actually waited 10 years," says Ms. Poletti. She and husband Paul have a daughter, Mary, who is a sophomore at Sacred Heart Prep. They have been residents of Woodside since 1989.

Three years ago the partners split their business, and Ms. Poletti as Poletti Associates Inc. now occupies half of the original building.

What are current trends in office furnishing? "About half of our projects are contemporary, half are traditional," she says.

She keeps up with the latest in the industry through the many manufacturers representatives who call on the company, and by visiting showrooms.

She sees clients becoming more aware of the environment and notes reps are carrying lines that are "green." Ergonomics, the science that seeks to adapt working conditions to suit the worker, is an important consideration today.

Changes have occurred in computer equipment as well. The once bulky computers of early days have been replaced by much smaller and sleeker versions.

Today, Sue Poletti finds satisfaction in her chosen career. "Since I was a teenager I knew I wanted to be a designer."

After graduating with a degree in art history from Furman University in Greenville, South Carolina, she began working in residential interior design.

"Clients began to ask me to help furnish their offices," she says. "It (commercial design) whet my appetite when I was given both a budget and a deadline. I thought this is for me!" ■

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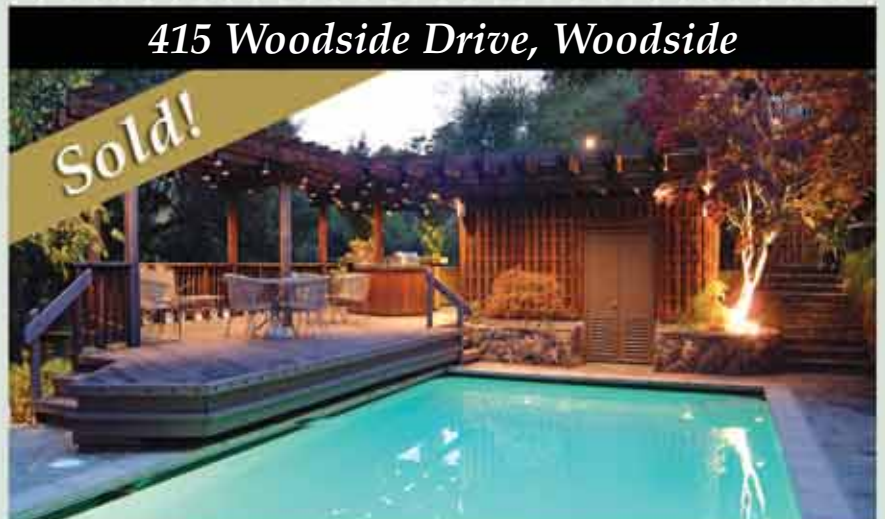
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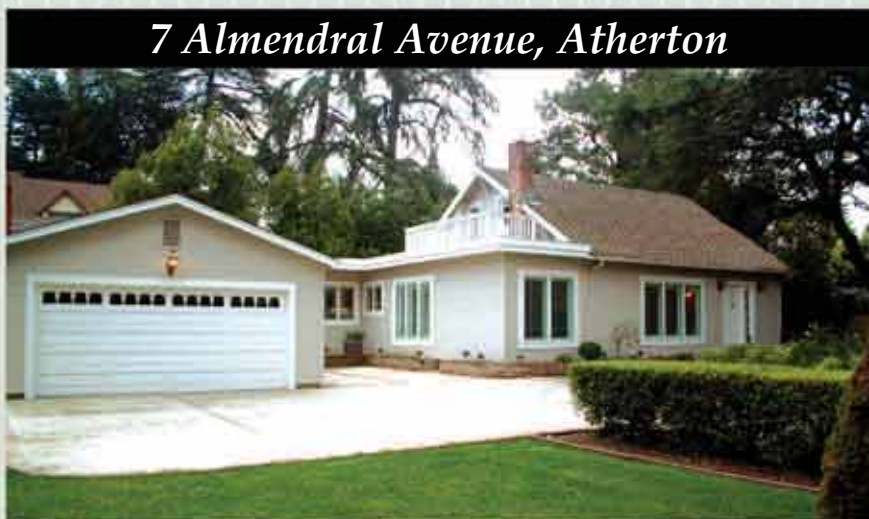

## Kids get jump-start on careers

Seventh graders at Selby Lane School in Atherton get an early start in learning on-the-job skills by spending a day with executives and professionals from a variety of industries.

The two-year-old Career Day program is sponsored by Selby Education Foundation, which raises funds for the K-8 school, and Hispanic-Net, made up Hispanic entrepreneurs and high-tech executives.

Participating businesses

include Electronic Arts, Alain Pinel Realtors and the Crown Plaza Hotel, as well as a government agency: the Atherton Police Department.

After the onsite visits, the students discuss their observations and ideas in classroom debriefing sessions.

Students are also encouraged to explore areas of interest on their own and with their volunteer Career Day coordinators, said Del Guerrero-Owen.

# Woodside Priory School graduates 49 seniors

Forty-nine Woodside Priory School graduates marched with faculty, administrators and trustees at an outdoor graduation ceremony May 26 at the college preparatory school in Portola Valley.

Guest speaker Donald Kennedy, president emeritus of Stanford University and a professor in the Center for Environmental Sciences, congratulated students and parents for surviving the "annual college admissions madness." It a process, he said, that "badly needs re-engineering."

He told students that evidence shows people are very good at embracing what life deals them, validating their choices, and refusing to stay stuck in discouragement. "That's why you meet so many happy people who have gotten into their second- or third-choice colleges," he said.

Professor Kennedy complimented the school on the concept of "service learning," bringing volunteer service experiences into the classroom for serious academic exploration.

"You should be proud that your school is among the pioneers," he said.

Headmaster Tim Molak remarked that the atmosphere the students enjoyed at Woodside Priory comes from the Benedictine philosophy of faith, learning and values practiced as a community.

Student speaker Stephanie Stoll recalled that, as a scared beginner at high school life, how reassuring it was to be at a campus where "everybody knows your name." She also commented that the breadth of experience had a lot to do with growing up.

"You introduced us to a world outside of ourselves and helped us open our minds," she said. Guests to the campus, such as a World War II Holocaust survivor and Tibetan Buddhist monks, were among such experiences.

Molly Magnuson, student speaker and student body president, cited five lessons she thinks the class learned: you may have it all, but if you don't

have good friends, you have nothing; if at first you don't succeed, try again; school can be fun; teachers are real people; and life is what you make of it.

#### RESOLUTION NO. \_\_\_\_\_ A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MENLO PARK AUTHORIZING THE COLLECTION OF A REGULATORY FEE TO IMPLEMENT THE MENLO PARK LOCAL STORMWATER MANAGEMENT PLAN

WHEREAS, Section 402(p) of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S.C. 1251 et seq.) as amended by the Water Quality Control Act of 1987, requires that all large and medium sized incorporated municipalities must "effectively" prohibit non-storm water discharges into storm sewers; and further requires controls to reduce the discharge of pollutants from stormwater systems to waters of the United

States to the maximum extent practicable.

WHEREAS, the City of Menlo Park, in conjunction with all of the incorporated cities in San Mateo County, have prepared the Stormwater Management Plan, which has a General Program to be administered and funded through the San Mateo County Flood Control District, and a specific program for each city, to be initially administered and funded by each city.

WHEREAS, the Menlo Park Specific Program includes those efforts and programs required to be undertaken by the City of Menlo Park to support and address its responsibility to regulate and enforce local pollution control components under the Stormwater Management Plan.

WHEREAS, the Menlo Park City Council is authorized and/or mandated by Ordinance 859 adopted on July 12, 1994, the following federal and/or state statutes: the federal Clean Water Act as amended in 1987; the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System Permit Application Regulations for Stormwater Discharges; the California Constitution, Article XI, Section 7 of the California Water Code Section 13002; and Part 3 of Division 5 of the California Health and Safety Code to impose a regulatory fee to enforce the local stormwater pollution control components of the San Mateo County Stormwater Management Plan upon the businesses, entities, residents and unimproved properties of the City of Menlo Park.

That the Menlo Park Director of Engineering Services is hereby directed to file, or cause to be filed, the amount of regulatory fees as described and shown on the attached Exhibit "A" including the diagram shown on the County Assessor's maps to be imposed and the parcels upon which such regulatory fees are imposed, with the County Auditor and/or the County Tax Collector of the County of San Mateo no later than August 4, 2006. For each parcel upon which a regulatory fee has been imposed, the regulatory fee shall appear as a separate item on the tax bill and shall be levied and collected at the same time and in the same manner as the general tax levy for City purposes.

3. That the Director of Engineering Services is authorized to enter into those agreements necessary to have the County of San Mateo perform the regulatory fee collection services required; and the City Council hereby authorizes the County of San Mateo to perform such services, and for the City to pay the County of San Mateo for the reasonable costs of those collection services so provided.
