Moments in time

Nostalgic paintings by Atherton artist
to be featured at Kings Mountain Art Fair

Atherton artist Jacqueline Osborn says her paintings tell a story of another era, place and generation. Ms. Osborn, who has lived half her life in California, the other half in her native England, will show her work at the Kings Mountain Art Fair for the first time this weekend.

Her acrylic and oil paintings, largely depicting the period between the world wars, reflect strong ties to her roots and her father's vivid storytelling, according to the artist.

"Dance, Dance" shows 1940s-era couples twirling around a dance floor. "Nana" depicts an older woman and child, both with parasols, wading at the seashore. "A Day in the Country" features two cloche-hatted young women driving in a convertible. The faces of subjects are often turned away.

Born and raised in London, Ms. Osborn graduated from the Southend School of Art and Design in Essex and worked as a fashion illustrator and designer for a high-end fashion house in London. She came to the United States in 1972 for an 18-month stint as a fashion illustrator and never left. Since then she has worked as a commercial artist and an illustrator for *Sunset Magazine*.

She met her husband, well-known artist Steve Osborn, in Palo Alto when a friend introduced them, saying, "You need to show your work to Steve Osborn. He's a big artist in town."

They have been married for 25 years.

At the time of their wedding, Ms. Osborn was working for *Sunset Magazine*. Photographs of their wedding in the Children's Secret Garden in Palo Alto were published in the magazine.

The couple lived in Palo Alto for many years, raising their two children. They later moved to New Mexico for two years to paint full-time. Three years ago they moved to

Art in the redwoods at Kings Mountain Fair

Annual Labor Day event raises funds for volunteer fire department

Kings Mountain Art Fair, a favorite Labor Day weekend outing for 43 years, will once again take place in the redwood forests adjacent to the Kings Mountain Community Center, 13889 Skyline Blvd., above Woodside.

The fair, held at the height of the fire season, raises funds for the local volunteer fire department. "This year, after the long wet season, the overabundance of vegetation, then the long hot

spell, forest fires are a serious worry," says Kathy Kennedy of the fair committee.

The first fair was held in a local barn in 1963. After a serious fire in 1964, the mountain folks decided future funds would be used to build a firehouse. Today the Kings Mountain Fire Department is fully equipped and responds to 160 calls a year.

The fair takes place September 2, 3 and 4, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. It features juried arts and crafts from more than 130 artists presenting oil paintings, water colors, serigraphs, sculptures, collages, photography, jewelry, wearable arts, hand-crafted toys, heirloom furniture, quilts and more. The juried artists are joined by 30

local "Mountain Folk" artists to make sure the fair keeps its local flavor.

Kings Mountain residents are proud there are no sound stages, no wine tastings, and no corporate sponsors at the fair. Volunteers pitch in to prepare an outdoor pancake breakfast, starting at 8 a.m. Other food, wine, beer

and beverages will be served from 11:30 a.m.

Supervised children's activities and games take place all day in "Kiddie Hollow." There will be spin art, glitter crafts, games and reading under supervision while parents visit exhibits.

'Grandma Jenny's' cookies

The parents of Kings Mountain Elementary School kids are baking 3,700 plate-sized cookies to raise funds for their school. The fair's cookie booth will sell cookies made from "Grandma Jenny's" secret recipes: chocolate chip, oatmeal raisin, peanut butter, and toffee. "This year there will be a new kind of cookie, but you have to come to the fair to find out what it is," says Ms. Kennedy.

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Atherton, where they live with their grandson, William McIntyre. They have built "his and hers" studios where Ms. Osborn paints for eight hours a day.

While she remains anchored in California, Ms. Osborn says, "I'm like most expatriates, nurturing a quiet yearning to be back home. I do spend time there, but I'm never really sure whether I'm a visitor or whether I'm going home."

In her paintings, she says, "I reconnect with my roots. I re-visit a past generation ... familiar

places, scenes and events I weave into each piece. I find a lot of satisfaction in this and, of course, I love to paint."

Ms. Osborn will have four or five original paintings for sale at the art fair. The price? "All are over \$4,000."

Giclee (high-tech, high-resolution) prints on canvas (\$600) and prints on paper (\$400) will also be for sale.

Eileen Fredrikson started the cookie booth tradition 20 years ago. "We had tried making and selling a lot of things at the fair to raise money for the school," she says.

"Then one year we baked cookies, using my mother's recipes. They were a big hit, a much bigger hit than we counted on. Each night of the fair we raced down the mountain to buy more ingredients. We were baking cookies all night in every parent's oven on Kings Mountain."

This year, parent Katy Katzenberger organized the cookie bake, which was held at Wedemeyer's bakery in South San Francisco the Saturday before the fair. The volunteers baked for eight hours, using 1,268 pounds of flour, sugar and eggs.

Parents and kids sell the cookies at the booth next to the "cook shack." "The kindergartners love selling cookies," says Ms. Katzenberger. "My daughter, Claire, stands on a box behind the booth so she can look taller."

The Menlo Park Library will commemorate a woman recognized as one of the founders of modern dance in a program called "The Life and Work of Isadora Duncan" on Saturday, September 2, at 11 a.m.

Born in San Francisco, Ms. Duncan developed a style of dance based on free and natural movements shortly after the turn of the 20th century. She called it "free dance," and broke with the more rigid styles of ballet and show dancing.

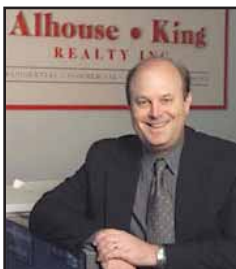
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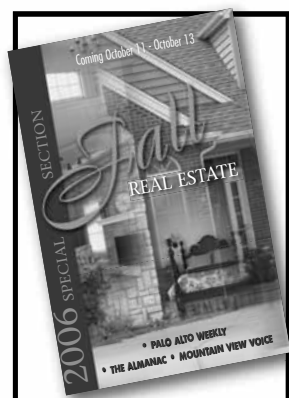

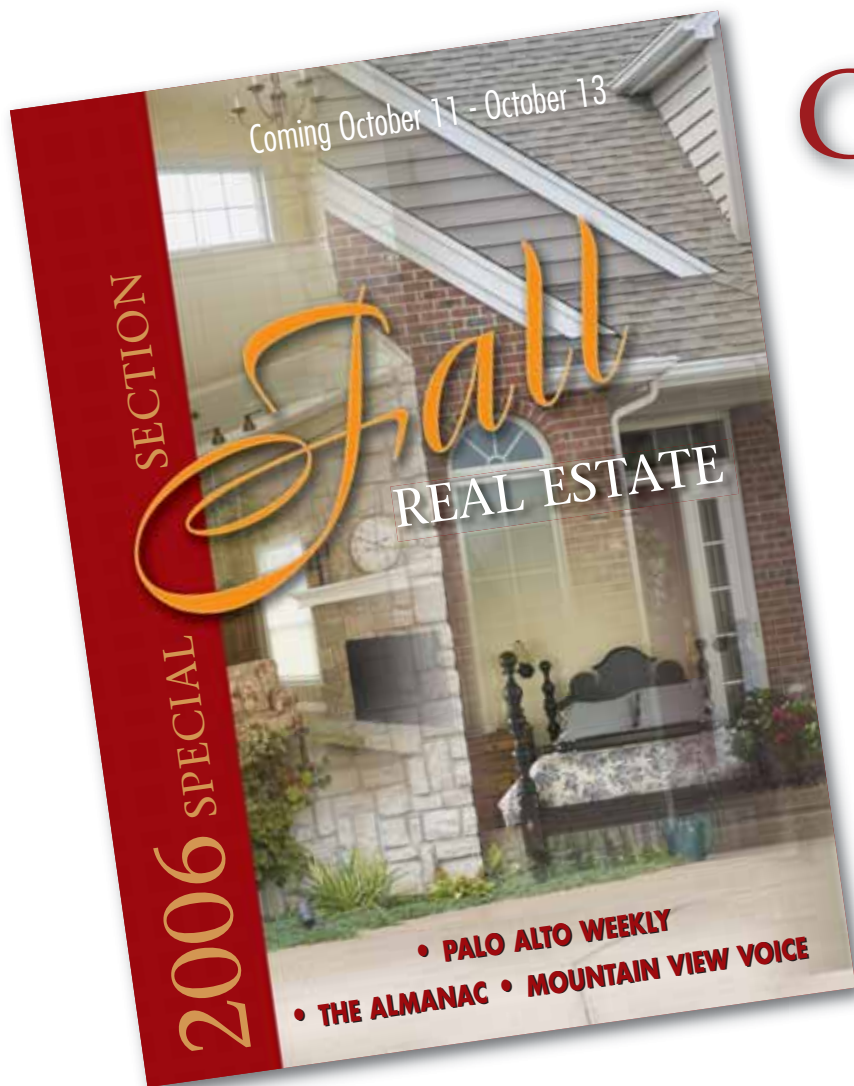
