

Ann's Coffee Shop

It's a Menlo Park landmark that serves up a slice of nostalgia along with your pie

In downtown Menlo Park you can dine on oysters and escargot, sushi and sashimi, pastries and profiteroles, but there's only one place that features creamed tuna on toast.

That would be Ann's Coffee Shop, which has been serving Menlo Park since 1946. Ann's has gone through several ownership changes since Ann Gilbert started the business. Pete Pappas, who has been in the restaurant business for 50 years, bought the place in 1992. His son, Nick, is general manager and cousin Danny Kevetos runs the kitchen in back.

Eddie Mejia, who worked at the original Ann's and is still there after 40 years, shows up at 6:30 a.m. to start soups of the day, fix the pot roast and bake pies. He makes five varieties from scratch, including a luscious coconut cream, peach, and apple — made with fresh apples. During the holidays, he makes mince pies. Come spring, it's time for rhubarb pie. Folks rave about the rhubarb pie, even those who say they don't like rhubarb.

To walk into Ann's is a step back in time. It's 1950, when coffee shops were on every corner. Diners sit at the Formica counter or in high-backed orange vinyl booths that overlook busy Santa Cruz Avenue. The walls are adorned with huge paintings of animals, among other things, that echo the yellow, orange and brown color theme. Nobody knows their origin. They've been there since Mr. Pappas bought the place.

Nick Pappas presides at the cash register, where credit

cards are not accepted. He schmoozes with the customers, many of whom are regulars. "We have some who come in every day, even twice a day," says Mr. Pappas. "One lady comes in at 11:20 a.m. every day. On Thursday, she always orders spaghetti to take home."

Nick's godfather, George Pappas, also presides at the cash register.

The bright orange menu holds no surprises. Entrees are roast pork on Monday, corned beef and cabbage on Tues-

day, meatloaf on Wednesday, leg of lamb on Thursday and Saturday, spaghetti on Thursday, baked hash and creamed tuna on toast on Friday, and roast turkey with dressing on Saturday. The menu has remained the same since Mr. Pappas took over the restaurant.

Ann's is open for breakfast and lunch Monday through Saturday. Breakfast is served all day. Saturday is the busiest day of the week. "It's crazy in here," says Nick.

Despite the craziness, the longtime servers are friendly and efficient. A recent lunch order arrived in five minutes and Rosalie Sanchez, our waitress, came by to refill my coffee cup frequently.

A coffee shop isn't really about coffee. For that, walk down a couple of blocks to Peet's. The coffee at Ann's is served in classic thick white china cups. No lattes or espresso here. It's good coffee like your mom used to make when Maxwell House Coffee sold for 69 cents a pound. At Ann's, a cup sells for \$1.75.

On a recent visit I ordered a grilled cheese sandwich with tomato (\$5.85). It came with a choice of potato salad, cole slaw, green salad, Jello or potato chips. The sandwich was tasty — plain old American cheese with lots of tomato slices on rye bread.

On a later visit, I had the hot turkey sandwich with mashed potatoes and gravy (\$8.50). It was real turkey and there was lots of it. The pale gravy was good, but a dash of Kitchen Bouquet would have given it a more appealing color.

My companion ordered the cheese omelet, which was fine,

but the best part was the side of crispy hash brown potatoes. They were grilled to a golden brown and I helped her finish every bite.

The mince pie was fine, with a thin, flaky crust and rich filling. Regulars know that Ann's is one of the few places left where you can order mince pie.

When he's not too busy, Nick Pappas likes to make the milkshakes (\$4.25). "The thicker, the better," he says. They come in chocolate, vanilla and strawberry. For \$4.50 you can have a banana shake: same ingredients, with a

whole banana added.

The menu also includes the soup of the day, salads, sandwich plates, cold sandwiches, lo-cal plates and desserts. How long has it been since you've seen a lo-cal plate featuring a jumbo hamburger patty with cottage cheese and tomato (\$7.25)?

Many of the shops that once lined Santa Cruz Avenue are gone, replaced by chi-chi boutiques and upscale restaurants. Old-timers recall Sprouse-Reitz five-and-dime, Stevens Fabrics, Consumer Market, Clifford's Drugs, Pink Pastry Shop, Harry's Juvenile and the Children's Bootery. Ann's, Menlo Florist (next door), and

Flegel's are all businesses that have passed the 50-year mark.

Drop in Ann's early in the morning and you'll see old cronies who get together for coffee and conversation. At lunch, you might sit next to women who have known each other since school days at St. Joseph's. On Saturday, catch the dad who is taking the kids out for breakfast.

Atherton couple organizes celebrity ballroom competition

Barbara Gore of Atherton has a new venture. On Saturday and Sunday, March 10-11, she and partner Glenn Weiss are putting on the City Lights Ball, a ballroom dance competition and show, at the Regency Center Ballroom in San Francisco.

Ms. Gore started dancing as a hobby six years ago. She has a background of 22 years in sales and marketing management in the software and online services arena. She now dances as an amateur in the pro-am ballroom dancing division competition.

Her dancing partner is 10-time U.S. International Standard Ballroom Dancing champion Victor Veyrasset.

She met Mr. Weiss two years ago when she signed up for dance lessons with him at the Starlite Dance Club in Sunnyvale. A child prodigy in dance in Denmark, Glenn Weiss, 48, was twice named world champion in standard ballroom dancing. He retired as a competitive dancer when in his 20s.

Today he provides ballroom choreography for the Fox television show, "So You Think You Can Dance." He is an international dance judge and has trained many champion competitors. He teaches both group and individual lessons at the Starlite Dance Club, and Ms. Gore is his assistant. "I'm Vanna," she says. "I don't say anything."

Diamonds and bubble gum

The Atherton couple's romance began over bubble gum. "I love bubble gum," says Ms. Gore. She also likes beautiful jewelry. One day when she walked into the room blowing a huge bubble, Mr. Weiss said to a friend, "She's funny. Diamonds and bubble gum. I like that."

Organizing the City Lights Ball is the couple's first business venture together. They bought the rights to the competition from a friend who was retiring to have a baby. This is the 11th year for the ball, which is held at the Regency Center Ballroom at 1300 Van Ness Ave. in San Francisco. "It's just a

beautiful site, very elegant," says Ms. Gore.

The highlight of the competition on Saturday, March 10, will be a performance by U.S. finalists Anna Mikhed and Victor Fung, who performed on "Dancing With the Stars."

"Victor is going to be the next U.S. champion. He's number two right now," says Ms. Gore.

Also on Saturday evening, Anna Trebunskaya will perform with Pavlo Barsuk, her professional Latin partner. Anna will be remembered by fans as Jerry Rice's partner on "Dancing With the Stars."

Sunday's evening show will feature several couples, including Erica Ridgeway of San Jose and her partner, Andrea Faraci from Milan, who are U.S. National Amateur Standard finalists. Daytime competitions will cover juniors (the youngest is 4), professionals dancing with amateurs, formation teams and solo performances. About 200 dancers are expected to take part.

There are two shows daily: 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and evening shows starting at 6 p.m. Tickets range from \$20 for the daytime show, general admission, to \$45 for table seats for the evening performances.

Ms. Gore is a real believer in ballroom dancing. "I'd love to figure out a way to get more people into dancing. Dance competition is a lot more popular in Europe, where it's taught in the schools. Denmark is a perfect example. There it's accepted as a sport, like soccer."

In this country it is being embraced by students at the college level. There are ballroom dancing clubs at both Berkeley and Stanford.

Barbara Gore recommends dancing for those "in transition," who are dealing with a loss or divorce. "It's a great way to meet others on a casual basis, no strings attached. Just fun and diversion."

Don't think you have to be young and lithe to dance either, says Ms. Gore, who sees folks in their 80s and 90s still twirling around the dance floor. "All you need to dance is a love of music."

Lorry Lokey pledges \$33 million for stem cell research center

Lorry Lokey of Atherton, has pledged a minimum of \$33 million to build a home for Stanford University's Institute for Stem Cell Biology and Regenerative Medicine, the university announced Feb. 27.

Mr. Lokey, the founder of Business Wire, has been a strong supporter of education and science and turned his attention to stem-cell research in 2000 when the federal government limited funding for such research, the university said in a press

release. "The important thing to me is that stem cells might not only extend life, but also improve the quality of life, as so many people suffer in their later years," Mr. Lokey said. "But I think stem cells will have applications across the entire life span."

Groundbreaking for a new building for stem-cell laboratories is expected to occur in 2009, with completion in 2011.

Medical School Dean Philip

Pizzo said: "Because of this wonderful gift, we will be able to proceed with planning the space and facilities to house superb faculty and foster the process of basic discovery that ultimately leads to the translation of this knowledge to improve the lives of patients suffering from cancer, neurodegenerative processes, heart failure, immune dysfunction and others."

"This is an extraordinarily

exciting time in science and medicine, and I am deeply appreciative to Larry Lokey for his confidence in us and his support for Stanford."

Mr. Lokey is a 1949 Stanford journalism graduate. He had worked on the Stanford Daily and became its editor. After graduation, he went to work for United Press, which later became UPI, and launched Business Wire in San Francisco in 1961. The agency distributes

an average of 17,000 corporate and academic press releases each month.

When Mr. Lokey sold Business Wire last year, it was valued at more than \$500 million.

Mr. Lokey told Stanford he is enjoying giving away his fortune, donating about \$300 million to various educational institutions, including Stanford, in recent years.

Stanford's 25-year-old International Policy Studies master's program will double in length and expand its scope thanks to a

\$7.5 million gift from Susan Ford Dorsey of Woodside, president of the Sand Hill Foundation. The gift has been matched by university funds to create a \$15 million endowment.

The program prepares its graduates for careers in international policy-making and advocacy. It has been renamed the Ford Dorsey International

Policy Studies program.

Ms. Ford Dorsey and her husband, Mike, serve on committees of the Stanford Challenge, which is seeking to raise \$4.3 billion to expand the university's role in addressing global challenges and training the next generation of leaders.

Steve Stedman is the director of the program, which will admit about 30 students a year, with up to half coming from outside the United States.
