SOUTH ASIAN CHIC

ENTREPRENEUR SEES BRIGHT FUTURE IN EASTERN-INSPIRED FASHIONS

A change in fashion isn't just a sign of the times. It can signify a change in attitudes, affluence — or demographics.

No one watches this last aspect more closely than Lekha Srinivasan, a Mountain View entrepreneur (not to mention mother, downtown resident and former high-tech project manager) who has turned her own savvy for imports and organization into an online clothing outlet, ZenTrend.

Noticing an increasing popularity here in South Asian clothing — kurtas (traditional Indian shirts) and pashmi-

nas became widely available a few years back, due in part, no doubt, to the ever-growing South Asian population in Silicon Valley — Ms. Srinivasan decided to bring the famously colorful, high-quality textiles of her native India back to California. With the help of her own team of designers, the dramatic embroideries, sexy sequins and brilliant brocades have been given a Western spin.

At first glance, ZenTrend's offerings might seem exotic: an all-silk, gold-embellished block print skirt with a lightly sequined top. A halter silk dress in brown and rust with a beaded hemline just above the knees.

But Srinivasan knows that's what fashion trends are all about. Exotic designs are introduced as cutting-edge fashion before they enter the mainstream. Eventually, they become common enough that they don't seem exotic at all.

"Brocade is a heavy fabric and loved in the subcontinent of India and Pakistan, but finding no place in contemporary designs," Srinivasan notes.

Just wait — it's only a matter of time.

Toned-down Bollywood

Several ZenTrend items were just the ticket for Natasha Dantzig, editor of New York-based SheFinds.com.

"Indian inspired clothing is huge right now, and I love the

style, but want to avoid looking like I stepped directly off a Bollywood set," Ms. Dantzig wrote on the Web site. "The pieces I chose, this silk halter contrast dress, and this stunning silk camisole with silver embroidery from ZenTrend.com, are just what I had in mind. I wore the dress out to dinner, and three different women asked where it was from."

Ms. Srinivasan says she had similar experiences — wowing her friends whenever she wore her Indian blouses, with their quality fabrics and embroidery — which helped convince her to start the company.

"I would come back [from India] and people would love my clothes," she said. "But everything you get back home is traditional, and the product had to be contemporary. You have high-end designers in India who are comparable to what I had in mind, but offering \$400 to \$500 apiece.

"I realized I knew what it takes to manufacture the outfit and I could create something stylish in an affordable price range."

ZenTrend tops start at \$45, and dresses at \$65, in a variety of shades and colors that are combined to accentuate traditional motifs and embroidered prints. Shirts are made in sizes 6 to 12, while skirts are available from small to X-large.

Lately, Ms. Srinivasan has been showing off her spring collection in small gatherings, and looking forward to her

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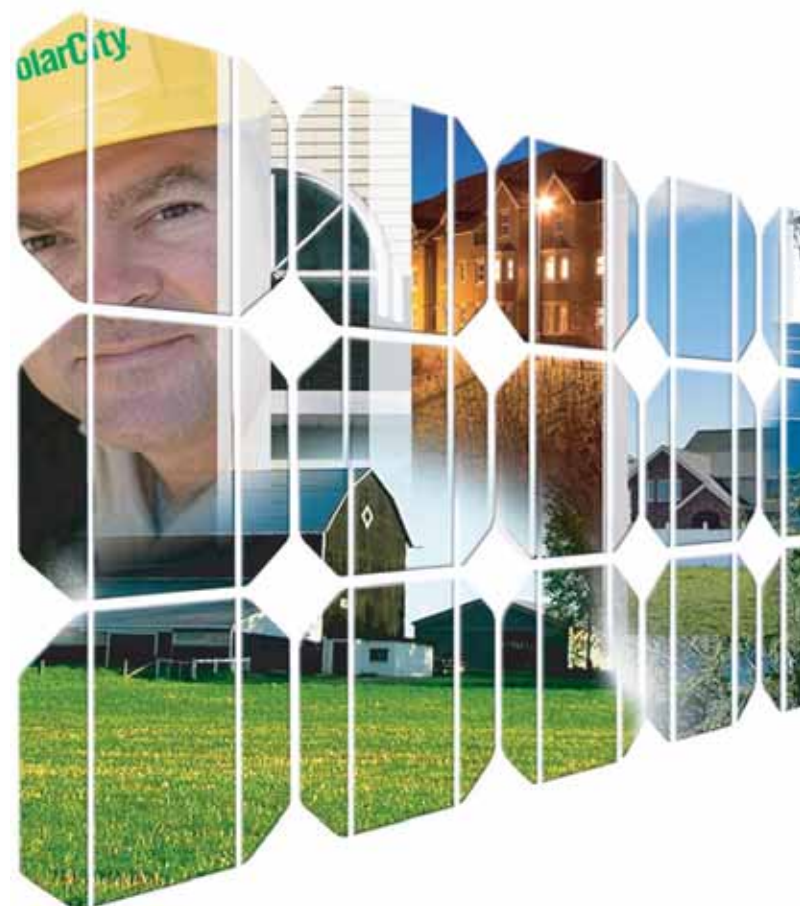

new lineup. "My summer collection will be added within the next 1.5 to 2 months," she said.

The modern outlet

Besides the clothes themselves, Ms. Srinivasan, 41, found other ways to break the mold. For one, she decided to do away with the brick-and-mortar retail model, and her wares are offered online only at www.zentrend.com.

Her method of obtaining ZenTrend's designs — bringing the textiles and inspirations from India and having the clothes created by Indian designers — is another atypical approach.

From her home here (she now divides her time between Mountain View and New Delhi), Ms. Srinivasan contacted suppliers and buyers using an Indian trade Web site. Getting the supply-chain process in place took six months of sample testing and finalizing a team of budding designers, she said.

Happy with her team of designers, Ms. Srinivasan exchanges ideas on new pieces with them, keeps an eye out for the newest Indian fabric, and otherwise spends time with her 9-year old daughter. She said styling outfits is proving to be the easier part of her new venture.

"The biggest challenge is marketing. I thought getting the supply chain in place would be tough, but you are in a market that is very, very competitive — it's a trillion-dollar industry," she said.

Ms. Srinivasan says she now has a cross section of shoppers — whom she identifies as students, working women and housewives — visiting www.zentrend.com. There is a 30-day money-back guarantee for online shoppers, and Srinivasan is currently seeking a small boutique to stock her clothing. ■

Exotic inspirations

Aska Clothing's original items made from textiles, designs of far-off locales

It's impossible to pin down just one place where Sachi Uyei's eclectic collection of tops, accessories and gifts comes from. At her Los Altos outlet, Aska Clothing, Uyei showcases shirts, scarves, shoes, jewelry, decor and more inspired by cultures throughout Asia and Europe.

"I needed a window when I started out. Now the artists have one here," she said of her outlet in downtown Los Altos, which serves as a gallery for several artists and designers.

Like Lekha Srinivasan, Ms. Uyei sought inspiration from her native country, Japan, when she started seven years ago in Palo Alto. Using old kimono fabric she found in San Francisco, Ms. Uyei

began designing shirts and dresses tailored to American tastes.

To this day, she said, she uses her instinct to test what works with her customers who followed her when she moved to Los Altos. "I found that if I use unique textile, they love it," she said.

The Aska clothing line primarily uses woven silk, georgette, parachute material and polyester. This variety of fabrics is used to fashion scarves, shirts, jackets, shoes, and satchels.

Visitors should be prepared for exquisite little surprises squeezed tightly among shelves and corners all over the outlet, such as hand-woven eyeglass cases next to batik room dividers.

Ms. Uyei said she consid-

ers each piece a work of art. Pure silk organza mix shirts in rich shades of orange, turquoise and purple start at \$50, while dress shirts using kimono fabric start at \$150. The most expensive item at Aska is a \$450 silk kimono jacket.

Having access to a multitude of fabrics in the San Francisco market, Ms. Uyei said Aska Clothing now houses items made of cloth from Japan, China, Indonesia, India, Portugal, Poland and Germany. All material has to pass a stringent hand wash test before it can be used, she said. That diversity is set to increase with the upcoming Annual Spring Artists Gathering on April 24 and 25 to be held at Aska Clothing.

POST moves headquarters to green building

As of March 5, the Peninsula Open Space Trust (POST) has left its longtime headquarters at 3000 Sand Hill Road; it is now officially based at 222 High St., three blocks north of University Avenue, in downtown Palo Alto.

Last year the nonprofit land trust, which has preserved almost 60,000 acres of Peninsula land

for open space and agriculture over the last 30 years, bought the building formerly occupied by the Foundation for Global Community.

POST has refurbished the former auto-body shop, which already had solar panels, with sustainable, non-polluting materials. With the Caltrain station nearby,

its 25 staff members will have easy access to public transportation.

"We wanted to enhance the green nature of the building and stay true to our organization's land-saving mission," said POST President Audrey Rust.

Hillview youth competes in state-wide geography bee

Kurt Kessler of Atherton, an eighth-grader at Hillview Middle School in Menlo Park, has qualified to represent the school at the state level of the National Geographic Bee on Friday, March 30, at Cosumnes River College in Sacramento.

More than 2000 schools from Yreka to Calexico competed this year in school geography bees, and only the top 100 students in California advanced to the state level.

The winner of this geography bee will represent California in the

national competition, which will be held May 22-23 at the National Geographic Society headquarters in Washington, D.C.

Kurt, the school champion, was invited to the state competition after taking a written multiple-choice test.

The National Geographic Society developed the National Geographic Bee in response to concern about the lack of geographic knowledge among young people in the U.S.

Each year, during the month after the winter break, Hillview Middle School holds its school-wide spelling and geography bees. Class champions are selected through section contests, and those winners participate in

lunch-time competitions.

Geography bee: This year, Kurt Kessler — last year's seventh-grade geography champ — retained his grade title in the eighth grade, and also finished first in the school, followed by another eighth-grader, Kai Masuda. Seventh-grader Sarah Cassebonne came in third, with Patrick Reed as that grade level's runner-up. Ben Weiner and Nathan Elkins finished first and second, respectively, in the sixth grade.

Spelling bee: Ben Weiner also

did extremely well in the spelling bee, coming in second, overall, behind eighth-grader and school champion Gregory Owen. Another sixth-grader, Olivia Ives, was third in the school competition. Alan Propp and Franklin Bird were first and second, respectively, in the seventh grade, and Sam Hausman was the runner-up among eighth-graders. M-A High robotics team 'racks 'n' rolls'

Here is a March 22 post in the Schools category of Town Square (www.AlmanacNews.com). This is by JoAnne Goldberg, a spokesperson for the M-A High Robotics Team.

Menlo-Atherton Robotics Team #766 was among 48 teams, including 10 teams from the Midpeninsula, participating in the 2007 "For Innovation and Recognition of Science and Technology" (FIRST) Silicon Valley Regional tournament in San Jose on March 16-17. Last year, the team won that tournament, and team members and families were hoping for a repeat.

FIRST announced the rules for the 2007 robotics challenge the first weekend in January. Teams had six weeks to build a robot that would participate in a three-on-three game, this year entitled "Rack 'n' Roll."

The 30 students on the M-A team and their six volunteer mentors spent most of their free time during those weeks in the campus workshop, including a string of 12-plus hour days to meet the deadline. The robot is a one-armed masterpiece of weld-

ing that can reliably sling a tube (the "roll") onto a multi-legged rack (the "rack").

After a day and a half of preliminary matches in San Jose, Team #766 was seeded eighth, enabling them to choose their teammates for the afternoon competition. Seeking robots with complementary strengths, the team aligned with a Microsoft-sponsored team from Franklin High School in Seattle and a team from the Athenian School in Danville.

In a series of tough two-minute matches, the triumvirate triumphed in the quarterfinals and semifinals. By the time the tournament had reached its final round, the M-A team was the only Midpeninsula team remaining. Team #766 and its teammates won the first match of the championship round, but fell behind in the second. With one final tiebreaker match to play, the M-A team's alliance came within seconds of victory, ultimately losing to a winning alliance comprising teams from Danville, San Ramon, and

Worcester, Massachusetts.

Regional tourney

The team will travel to the campus of the University of California at Davis to compete in the Sacramento Regional Tournament on March 29-30. The team won that tournament in 2005 and last year was seeded second after the preliminary matches, so the team members look forward to a strong showing.

11. **WITHDRAWAL OF PROPOSALS.** Any bid may be withdrawn at any time prior to the time fixed in the public notice for the opening of bids only by written request for the withdrawal of the bid filed with the Director of Engineering Services. The request shall be executed by the bidder or his/her duly authorized representative. The withdrawal of a bid does not prejudice the right of the bidder to file a new bid. Whether or not bids are opened exactly at the time fixed in the public notice for opening bids, a bid will not be received after that time nor may any bid be withdrawn after the time fixed in the public notice for opening of bids.

17. **SHORING AND BRACING.** Pursuant to the provisions of California Labor Code Section 6707, each bid submitted in response to this Notice to Bidders shall contain, as a bid item, adequate sheeting, shoring, and bracing, or equivalent method, for the protection of life and limb in trenches and open excavation, which shall conform to applicable safety orders. By listing this sum, the bidder warrants that its action does not convey tort liability to the City, Engineer and their employees, agents and consultants.

18. **AFFIRMATIVE ACTION.** Each prime and subcontract bidder will be required to comply with the City of Menlo Park Affirmative Action Program as set forth in Council Resolution No. 2340. Guidelines and report forms are provided with the Contract Documents and shall be considered part of any Contract made pursuant thereto. The prime contractor and each subcontractor shall complete the City of Menlo Park Compliance Report and submit it with the bid proposal or within 48 hours of the bid opening if you are the lowest or second lowest bidder.

19. **MINORITY EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM.** Prime contractors and subcontractors must submit their Minority Employment Program (MEP) to the Director of Engineering Services with their bids or within 48 hours of the bid opening.
