Cafes, teen zones, 'market places' and 'community living rooms,' says county library director

On the bookcase in Victoria Johnson's San Mateo office is a lackluster librarian action figure dressed in a calf-length, navy blue dress suit. If you push a button, she raises one index finger to her lips.

Ms. Johnson, with her turquoise sweater and flared skirt, presents a stark contrast — not only because of her fashionable appearance, but because of her notions, enthusiastically expressed, of how a library ought to work.

And "quiet" is not the operative word.

As director of library services for San Mateo County, Ms. Johnson oversees the 3.5 million library materials that circulate through the county's 12 libraries, which include branches in Atherton, Woodside, and Portola Valley. She believes strongly that lending materials should be made attractive and available to everyone, including the new generation of "digital natives,"

who receive and process information differently from older, "digital immigrants."

As part of her effort to attract the young, plugged-in generation to the library community, she's working toward putting into place a new type of library in San Mateo County — a model she calls "the library of the future."

This library, according to her vision, would include cutting-edge circulation technology, cafes, "teen zones," computer labs and homework centers, "marketplaces" to make popular books more accessible, family places and "community living rooms."

Ms. Johnson says this vision is not hers alone: She incorporates ideas submitted by all her branch managers to move into this next generation of library science.

On the surface, this new library model looks much more social and less academic than its predecessor. But it is nevertheless designed to keep the nuts and bolts of getting people the information they need intact.

As an example of the "library of the future," Ms. Johnson points to the recently built Belmont Library at 1110 Alameda de las Pulgas. Among its features is an "automated materials handling system" that looks something like an ATM machine and checks books in without the staff time required at most branches.

That facility also includes a cafe selling snacks and drinks, supplied and run by a vocational rehabilitation program — a feature whose time has come, Ms. Johnson says. Covered drinks will be allowed beyond the cafe inside the "library of the future," she says, noting that people already take their library books with them to dinner, to the beach, and sometimes to the bathtub.

Another new accommodation for updated libraries — this one certain to rankle some patrons: "Quiet" cell phone conversations will be allowed on library premises, Ms. Johnson says.

Although the county office of library services will push for modern features based on the "library of the future" model whenever a community renovates or rebuilds its library, decisions about the specifics will be collaborative, says

Anne-Marie Despain, assistant director of library services.

Locally, the Portola Valley library community will be going through that collaborative process as it builds a brand new facility, scheduled to open in 2008.

Changes ahead

Before computer technology, a librarian's job was very labor intensive, as each item had to be hand stamped, Ms. Johnson says. Her goal is to place 95 percent of the responsibility for checking materials in and out on the customer, leaving librarians more time to deal with people in a more personal way.

She says libraries will move toward providing more common meeting areas. A typical library will have a "family place," where babies, toddlers, young children and their parents can browse the picture books and where wall displays are scaled especially for them. The concept differs slightly from most existing children's sections in that there will be a designated storytelling place, whimsical lighting and a focus on relieving the harried young mother while helping to provide food for her child's brain.

The "community living room" would be designed to appeal to library patrons who prefer the traditional, hushed atmosphere. It would be fitted with comfortable chairs and ottomans, a gas fire, proximity to the periodicals, and "preferably a view," Ms. Johnson says.

But the space won't always provide sanctuary for customers who read best in total silence: Book groups and chamber music concerts could be scheduled in the community living room for afternoons and evenings, she notes.

With the library updates, traditional patrons who prefer a quiet environment for reading, browsing and research would do best to visit their library earlier in the day, Ms. Johnson advises.

The ability to buy a snack has attracted more youth to library "teen zones" after school in libraries that have food centers, Ms. Johnson says. A full stomach also leads to better behavior, she asserts, especially when high school students congregate in the group seating areas or make use of the glass-enclosed computer labs and homework centers, which employ volunteer coordinators from the Friends of the Library to ensure "quiet, contained work" at group tables.

A library "marketplace" in the

front area will be part of updated libraries. In the marketplace, multiple copies of the most popular books are displayed with their covers facing out, as in a bookstore. "You don't have to write down all the numbers and match them to the spines to find them, as in the old system," says Ms. Johnson. "It's a lot easier for people who aren't used to doing that."

Of course, the library of the future has a strong "virtual" presence. Online sites act just like branch locations. Reference and audio books can be checked out for 24 hours by downloading to the cardholder's personal computer or MP3 player.

The library also subscribes to more than 50 proprietary databases that patrons can access for free. In addition, live homework help is available online every day until 10 p.m.

Wireless Internet service is available for laptop computer use at all branch libraries. And two free hours per day of access to the Internet via desktop computers is available for any purpose, such as research, e-mailing, or even playing games.

The making of a librarian

After spending a decade at home raising her children, Ms. Johnson began her second career as a part-time clerk at the South Pasadena Public Library in 1982. She says she felt frustrated because, as a clerk, she was not allowed to answer patrons' questions.

She went back to school and earned her master's degree in library science, and from 1986 to 1995, worked at the Pasadena Public Library.

She was director of libraries at the Sunnyvale Public Library from 1995 to 2005, and has been at her present job since then. She and her husband, David Johnson, who is the business development manager for the city of Menlo Park, live in Sunnyvale.

Ms. Johnson says she is thrilled to go to work each day and be the facilitator for people to get access to the information they want. She quotes Margaret Fuller, the 19th century journalist whose words are written on the wall at the Belmont branch: "If you have knowledge, let others light their candles in it." ■

Brix faces Homefield in showdown

Brix of the Menlo-Atherton Little League will face Homefield Advantage of the Alpine/West Menlo Little League in the July Fourth Majors Division championship game.

Both teams advanced to the game by winning the championships of their respective leagues. Brix, which had a 15-8 record this season, beat Cashin for the Menlo-Atherton title, while Homefield beat Professional Insurance for the Alpine championship, improving the team's record to 16-2.

The July Fourth game starts at 9 a.m. in Menlo Park (Harrison Field in Burgess Park).

The matchup will feature top-notch pitching. In Brix's defeat of Cashin, star pitcher Jack Larson

struck out 14, while allowing only one hit, walking none and shutting out Cashin 6-0.

"Larson pitched the best game of his life in the biggest game of his life," said Brix co-manager Keith Newman.

However, Newman will have to hope Larson has another pitching gem left in him, as runs may be scarce against the tough pitching combination of Nick Lange and Mikey Diekroeger for Homefield.

Lange and Diekroeger combined to hold Professional Insurance to two runs — enough to ensure the victory for Homefield in the 3-2 Alpine league championship game.

Although his team lost eight games this year (compared to Homefield's two losses), Newman remained confident, noting that Brix has "really stepped up in the playoffs."

Brix players hope their timely hitting will carry over into the July Fourth showdown as four of the team's six runs against Cashin came during a two-out rally in the fourth inning. Pitcher Larson was able to aid his own cause in the fourth-inning rally, driving in two runs and later scoring.

"I know Alpine has a lot of talent in their league but M-A is all about heart," said Newman. "I like our chances."

Nonetheless, the Homefield team has produced six All-Stars in Lange, Diekroeger, Ryan Galvin, Colin Lockareff, Dominic Andrightto, and Zach Jones. ■

Parading to Burgess

Hop aboard your bikes, golf carts or floats and parade down Santa Cruz Avenue to Burgess Park for a day of activities. The parade begins at 11:30 a.m. from the parking lot off Santa Cruz and Chestnut Street.

At the park, enjoy carnival games, crafts, swimming, face painting, a climbing wall and more from noon to 2:30 p.m. A \$5 wristband fee will cover these family-friendly activities, and food will be available for purchase.

From noon to 4 p.m., the Menlo Park Historical Association booth will be selling "Menlo Park: Beyond the Gate," a historical look at the city. The MPHA booth will also be hosting an ice cream social from 1 to 3 p.m. for all members of the community.

Swinging at Stanford

Celebrate Independence Day a day early at Stanford University's Frost Amphitheatre on July 3. Picnic on the grass as Grammy-nominated swing band Big Bad Voodoo Daddy (BBVD) performs a lively set of jump-blues, jazz, and swing music. Featured on numerous television shows and in the movie, "Swingers," BBVD brings big-band music back with a modern spin.

Gates open at 5:30 p.m. for picnicking on the grass and the band will begin playing at 7:30. At 9:30 there will be a fireworks show.

Eco-chic

Move over hippies, environmentally friendly fashion has gone hip

An organic section may be commonplace at farmers' markets and in grocery stores — but in a clothing boutique?

Charina Cabanayan of Bloom Butik in downtown Palo Alto is one retailer who hopes her customers will soon be asking where the organic section is.

"Eco-fashion," as it is called, is an up-and-coming trend in the apparel industry, according to Ms. Cabanayan. She's planning on selling a line of organic apparel at her store.

"Where the trends are going is to the materials," said the designer-turned-boutique-owner.

"Eco-fashion" may conjure up notions of formless drawstring skirts and baggy tops handcrafted out of hemp — hardly the apparel of *fashionistas*.

But more and more, high fashion and environmentally friendly fabrics and practices are converging, Ms. Cabanayan said.

Indeed, if recent catwalks are any indication, eco-fashion seems to be gaining a toe-hold in the apparel industry.

Two years ago at New York Fashion Week, a show called "Future-Fashion" presented ecologically friendly couture by well-known designers such as Oscar de la Renta and Diane von Furstenberg.

Crafted out of recycled polyester and organically grown materials — cotton, hemp, bamboo, silk and more — the garments targeted clients who were hip, not hippies.

That same spring, Sausalito-based Wildlife Works sponsored a similar eco-fashion show, "Catwalk on the Wild Side," in San

Francisco in celebration of World Environment Day. The event included the designs from Edun (a clothing company launched by U2 singer Bono, wife Ali Hewson and designer Rogan Gregory), Luxury Eco by Linda Loudermilk, Loomstate by Rogan Gregory, Deborah Lindquist, Dosa by Christina Kim, Wildlife Works and others.

It even featured a "little green dress" — the classic little black dress reinvented out of earth-friendly hemp/silk.

The event was repeated in 2006, and this spring, Wildlife Works put on its own show at London Fashion Week.

"I see it as a long-term trend," said Lynda Grose, a designer, consultant and adjunct professor who teaches sustainable fashion design at California College of the Arts in San Francisco.

In the early 1990s, she designed for Esprit when it and a few other companies attempted to go environmental with their clothing lines. Fashion magazines picked up on the novelty and even came out with "Green Consumer Guides," Ms. Grose recalled — but somehow eco-friendly clothing turned out to be more of a fad.

This time around will be different, though, she contends.

"It's definitely here to stay," she said. Consumers on the whole have become more environmentally conscious since the 1990s, fueling interest.

cotton programs" — including Whole Foods, Nordstrom, Timberland, REI and IKEA — and more than 1,200 small and medium-sized brands and retailers offered organic cotton products.

The trend of eco-fashion goes far beyond materials, however.

According to the Sustainable Technology Education Project, a group dedicated to increasing awareness of sustainable technology, "eco-fashion is about making clothes that take into account the environment, the health of consumers and the working conditions of people in the fashion industry."

Organically produced clothes — in addition to being made of materials that have been grown pesticide-free — ideally don't involve harmful dyes or bleaches; may

be made from recycled textiles; are durable, so people keep them longer; and are made by people working under fair-trade conditions.

Eco-fashion could also mean that a garment company is using a manufacturer near where it buys its fabrics, thus reducing the amount of both fuel used for transportation and air pollution created along the way, according to Ms. Cabanayan.

Currently, she said, clothing companies think little of buying fabrics in Korea and shipping them to the United States and then on to Peru for manufacturing.

"That's a lot of shipping back and forth," she said.

In her store last week, Ms. Cabanayan picked up a gray felt purse as a perfect example of a "sustainable" fashion accessory — one both locally conceived and produced.

The pod-shaped purse, consisting of a single piece of industrial wool felt and a zipper, was made by Berkeley-based Conphorm.

Sales of products made of organically grown cotton have been on the rise. In 2001, \$86 million

worth of organic cotton products were sold in the United States. By 2005, that figure had climbed to \$275 million, according to Oakland-based Organic Exchange, a nonprofit devoted to the expansion of the global organic cotton fiber supply.

In its "Global Organic Cotton Market Report," the organization predicted that by the end of 2008, worldwide sales would top \$2.6 billion — up from \$275 million in 2005.

The group also noted that more than 30 companies had "growing

"We can see that with organic food. We can see that with the purchase of Prius cars," she said. "People now know what organic is. People know what organic fiber is — it's not something you eat."

The industry, too, has changed. Many more companies are making organic products than in the 1990s, Ms. Grose said.

Statistics bear out that assertion.

The felt had been crafted out of manufacturers' fabric scraps. It was then cut and sewn in the Bay Area.

Last winter, the \$110 purse was a hot seller at the boutique, Ms. Cabanayan said.

She hopes Bono's line, Edun, will do as well with her customers.

Bloom Butik isn't the first downtown Palo Alto apparel shop to go organic.

Mary Jaiswal, owner of Cielo and Blu, has been selling eco-fashion for a few seasons. She stocks her stores with Loomstate, an American brand that uses organic cotton, and KOHZO, an earth-friendly Japanese line.

"I'm always looking for new ideas on how to be safe to the environment," she said.

She's had shoppers who came in specifically looking for eco-fashion; others discovered the clothes only after browsing.

"Some customers, they heard about it online. Bono is involved in this," she said.

"Some customers come into the store, and they have to make their choices" about buying organic versus non-organic, she added.

Sales of the clothing have been good.

"It's Palo Alto, after all. Everyone wants to help the environment," she said.

But environmentally practices can cost, especially when the supply of organic cotton, for example, is lower than non-organic, thus sending up the price. Are consumers willing to pay to be eco-friendly — with Loomstate T-shirts going for \$60 and jeans for \$163?

Ms. Grose thinks they will — if they like the product.

“People will pay for good design,” she said. “People don’t buy a garment because it’s organic. If it’s only organic and it doesn’t look good, people won’t buy it.” Offer people

an organic Beefy T, and they may pass on it.

Give them a look they like, at a price point they like, and that’s also well-made and they’ll bite, she said. At heart, buying clothing — organic or not — “is an emotional decision.”

Which is why Ms. Grose is hopeful now that top designers have gotten involved in the newest green-garment movement — better designs mean more interest.

“There’s a trickle-down theory. If high-fashion folks are doing it, others will copy them ... and it becomes mainstream,” she said. “It helps if top designers are involved.”

Even if some drop off after awhile, Ms. Grose still believes eco-fashion will — and should — be here for the long haul.

“This time around, it’s more of a stable industry,” she said. “The companies are very serious and very committed.”

And with the availability of a greater range of organic high-end fabrics — from bamboo silk to sustainable chiffon — eco-fashion may be poised to come into its own.

“It’s only limited by the creative ideas of the designer,” she said. ■

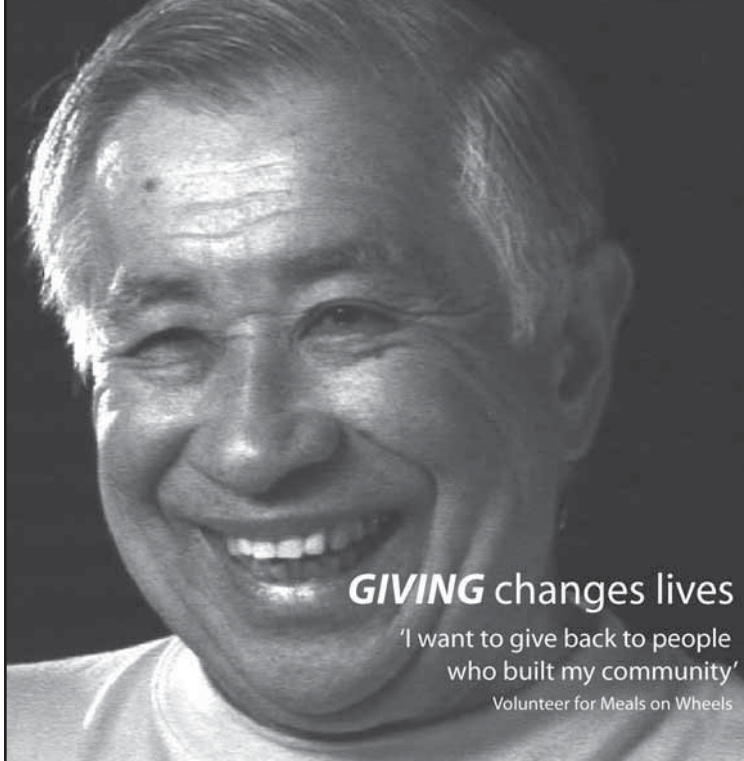

JUDITH WRIGHT MOREING



Of Atherton, California, entered into the presence of her Lord Jesus on June 5 at the age of 86.

Born February 10, 1921 in Elwood, Indiana, Judy was an accomplished pianist, violinist, singer and composer at a very young age.

In the 1930's Judy was awarded first prize in a song-writing contest resulting in the Paul Whiteman Orchestra, one of the most famous big bands of that time performing her song.

Judy reigned as Indiana's "Tomato Queen" in 1939, and thereafter attended DePauw University in Anderson, IN where she was a member of her sorority, "Alpha Chi Omega".

In the early 1940's she began her professional singing career with the George Olson Band and later the Henry King Orchestra where she met her husband, singer-trumpet player Bobby Borger. Together with the Henry King Orchestra, they traveled the country performing in famous nightclubs and venues like the Trocadero in Hollywood, CA. Judy and Bobby left HKO and soon formed a musical quartet, "The Three Punches And Judy" where they played the Cirque Room at the Fairmont Hotel in San Francisco.

After losing Bobby to cancer in 1945, KNBC radio featured Judy on her own radio show, "Judy's The Name" where the songstress captivated listeners with her voice, violin and charm deeming her, "The Sweetheart Of San Francisco".

In 1946 she met and married James Arthur Moreing and retired from her career to become a homemaker, raising 5

children; 2 sons and 3 daughters and eventually residing in Atherton.

At the age of 49 Judy surrendered her life to Jesus Christ and soon began composing songs that reflected her faith in God and recorded her album, "Rivers Of Living Water", "I Can Do All Things Through Christ" and "I Must Keep My Eyes On Thee" are just a few of the selections on her LP. Judy attended Peninsula Bible Church in Palo Alto, and was active in Bible Study Fellowship both as a student and teaching leader.

On March 19, 1971, at the age of 51, Judy suffered a serious stroke resulting in paralysis and loss of speech. After several years of hard work in speech and physical therapy sessions Judy was able to resume some of her normal activities as well as traveling with her husband of 45 years.

Judy is survived by her sons, James Moreing of Redwood City; William Moreing of Moss Beach; and daughters, Annie Lapoint of Atherton; Mia Russell of Redwood City; and 7 grandchildren.

Judy's warm and generous heart radiated the Love of Christ and her sweet spirit, and contagious laughter will be greatly missed but we are comforted by the knowledge that she is in heaven with her Lord, experiencing fullness of joy with her daughter, Jody; and beloved husband Jim.
