

AN EYE ON FASHION

Eyeglasses are so stylish even those with perfect vision covet a pair

So-called nerds and “poin-dexters” can breathe a sigh of relief. Eyeglasses have transformed from unwelcome stigmas into chic, desirable accessories — having four eyes is in style like never before.

The Peninsula is no stranger to the glasses craze. At the heart of Silicon Valley, glasses have been a popular fixture on local faces for years. In fact, when glasses first started to scale down to smaller frame sizes about eight years ago, opticians had to adopt new techniques to accommodate all of the computer users.

“The smaller glasses push the reading and distance areas together, which doesn’t work well for people who use computers a lot,” explains Bill Felices, the store manager of For Eyes in Palo Alto’s Town and Country Village. “We had to start re-fitting the glasses to accommodate them.”

Smaller frames marked the first stage in the metamorphosis of glasses from undesirable to fashionable. Now, high-end designers such as Burberry, Prada, Betsy Johnson and Caroline Her-

ra have joined the ranks of companies such as Guess and Calvin Klein in the pursuit of creating fun frames.

In fact, optician Eva Etter, who has owned Accent on Eyewear in downtown Menlo Park for almost 20 years, prefers to call glasses “eyewear.” She travels around the world every year in search of new trends in eyewear that she can bring into her store.

“It’s the jewelry for your face,” she says.

She notes that people are realizing that glasses can add to your features, rather than detract from them. Eyewear designers pay close attention to fashion as well as function.

“People are used to psychologically rejecting glasses, so we have to make them fun to wear,” Ms. Etter explains.

In an ironic twist, even some individuals with perfect, 20/20 vision now find themselves coveting a pair.

“A lot of younger people come in and buy non-prescription glasses

just to be in vogue,” admits Mr. Felices.

At Prospectacles Optometry in the Stanford Shopping Center, optician Grace Tumg has noticed that customers are spending more time deliberating over the appearance of potential frames.

“They want to be a little different than everyone else,” she says. “A lot of people even get two to three pairs for different looks.”

According to Ms. Tumg and Mr. Felices, the ratio of glasses to contact wearers is about 70 to 30 percent — but glasses are recommended even for those who wear contacts.

“Contacts aren’t the most comfortable thing to wear all day,” Ms. Tumg explains.

Framing your features

As the old saying goes, the eyes are the window to the soul — so why not frame those windows in style? Ms. Etter, Ms. Tumg and Mr. Felices all identified plastic frames as one of the most prevalent trends in eyewear today.

Stylish and functional, plastic frames can hold some of the stronger prescriptions and often prove sturdier than some of the lighter metal frames.

As plastics gain in popularity, the rimless glasses that were hot commodities several years ago are slowly fading, Mr. Felices says. However, many customers who desire a more simple look still veer toward the titanium and stainless steel options.

With the onset of plastics, the limited choices of brown, black or tortoise frames have expanded into a rainbow of colors. Vibrant shades are another current fad, says Ms. Etter, and warm colors such as reds and oranges correspond perfectly with the onset of autumn. Two-tonal frames, in which the outside and inside of the frames are accented with different, yet complimentary, hues, have also emerged as a new trend in eyewear.

Just as you might put on a fancier necklace for a nighttime

affair, you might also want to jazz up your regular pair of glasses for fancier occasions. Some opticians, such as Ms. Etter, will carry evening eyewear, which distinguishes itself from its daytime complement through its glitzier and more embellished qualities.

"There is even an option to put diamonds on them," she says.

Tasteful temples

The chic intricacy of glasses now extends beyond the frames. Designers of eyewear pay a significant amount of attention to the temples, which is the technical name for the sides of the glasses.

"In real life, we're being seen from the profile a lot, so the sides are very important," explains Ms. Etter.

From colors and gemstones to inscriptions and etchings, the temples are taking on a life of their own. They often provide an additional canvas for eyeglass designers to make their unique mark on their products.

"Brand recognition with glasses is really big," Mr. Felices says.

This holds especially true for children's glasses. In an attempt to make glasses less of a burden for children, the temples on children's glasses often feature

trademarked characters, such as Scooby Doo, on the sides.

Although many designers choose to stamp their company name on the sides of their glasses, others use unique etchings or patterns. Many people don't want to be walking billboards, Mr. Felices explains, and instead prefer the subtler trademarks.

The intricate temples on glasses can become a conversation piece in themselves.

"They really are works of art," Ms. Etter says.

Here comes the sun

Even more popular than standard prescription glasses are sunglasses, especially in California where the sun shines throughout the year. Whether with prescription or without, sunglasses are considered fashion accessories.

Sunglass trends are always in a state of flux. The recently popular aviator frames, which feature oversized, tear-drop shaped lenses and metal frames have seen a recent decline in sales, Ms. Etter and Mr. Felices say.

As with prescription glasses, sunglasses are now reflecting a retro style. The large, glamorous Jackie-O glasses of the 1960s are back, Ms. Etter says.

However, not everyone wants glasses that cover half of their face, she adds.

For those who prefer a clas-

sic pair of sunglasses, standard Ray-Bans are still popular. At Prospectacles, many people, particularly men, tend to prefer the variety of polarized glasses made by Maui Jim.

Helping you read

A majority of people don't require prescription glasses, but still need a pair of reading glasses. Even reading glasses have now been hit by the style bug.

Sold everywhere from your local drug store to Costco to small optical stores, reading glasses can be found in a variety of styles. At Prospectacles,

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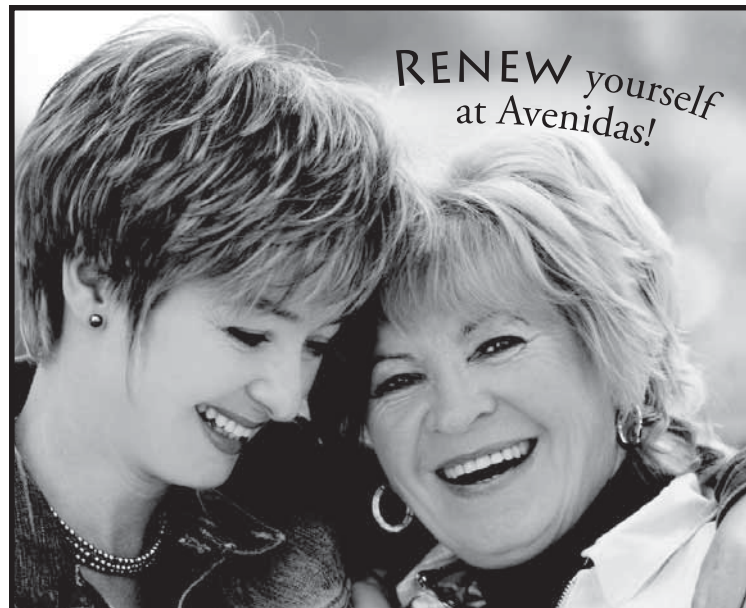

reading glasses range in cost from about \$45 to \$90 and are available in everything from the traditional silver and brown frames to bright purple.

Ms. Tung advises people to keep in mind that reading glasses are sold with the same prescription for both eyes. Many people require different magnification strengths for each eye or have an astigmatism, which is an irregularly shaped cornea or lens.

To prevent buying the incorrect prescription, she recommends that everyone — even those who think they need only a little magnification — get regular eye exams.

Shopping for your eyes

Asked for basic rules on how to pick the right pair of glasses for your face, Ms. Etter has two simple tips. Try not to match the shape of your face with the shape of the eyeglass frames. In other words, if your face is round, try to steer away from circular frames.

Her second tip is to work on

accenting your eye color. A blue-based red, for instance, can really bring out dark brown eyes.

Although they are "trendy," eyeglasses are not merely a cosmetic accessory. One must keep in mind the medical aspect of eyewear as well, Mr. Felices says. His philosophy is to fit the prescription to the frame and the face. A strong prescription might not work in certain frames, for example, or you might need bendable temples if you take your glasses on and off a lot. All of this needs to be kept in mind and communicated to your optician when you're buying a pair of glasses.

On the medical side, Mr. Felices, along with Ms. Tung and Ms. Etter, highly recommends that people invest in frames that have an anti-reflective coat, which helps reduce glare and makes driving at night easier.

For children, consider buying glasses that are shatter-resistant with bendable temples to help guarantee that the pair will last through recess.

For older people and those who need bifocals but don't want the

lines segmenting their glasses in the trademark bifocal style, progressives are a popular option. Progressives become increasingly stronger in magnification from the top to the bottom of the lens, explains Mr. Felices.

Due to the popularity of progressives, people who require

lenses with two distinct optical powers can now purchase some of the smaller, more trendy frames that were previously not an option for the bifocal wearer.

Prices for prescription glasses at these three stores range from \$150 to \$1,000. Although some eyewear might appear a bit

pricey, Ms. Etter asks many of her customers to put the investment in perspective.

"People spend so much money on shoes, but it's the face that we really notice," she says.

"It's the first thing that people see when they look at you," Ms. Tung echoes. ■

On-site registration starts at 8 a.m., with the walk scheduled from 9:30 to 11 a.m. The course follows a flat, three-mile route; participants have the option of taking a 1.5-mile shortcut.

The walk features scenic vistas of San Francisco and the Bay, and is accommodating to wheelchairs and strollers, but it's not advised for dogs.

Memory walks have been staged all over the country since 1989. Last year, 6,000 people showed up at this one. Mr. Daly hopes an even larger crowd will come this year and stay to enjoy

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CHARLES COOK PAINE

Charles Cook Paine, born Washington, DC July 31, 1917, died in Redwood City on September 12, 2007 – teacher, painter, sculptor, husband, and foster father.

Charles, his brother, Bill, and his mother, Leona, moved to La Honda while the boys were young. The boys attended Sequoia High School in the 1930s, driving from La Honda to Redwood City in a Model "A" Ford.

Charles met and married Barbara Gordon on February 29, 1936 while both were Sequoia High School students. Barbara died in 2001. Both were involved in the arts and Barbara was a published poet.

As foster parents Barbara and Charles opened their home to George Sowle, Paula Beckey Parks and Ed Kawata.

Charles served in the U.S. Army during W.W.II in New Guinea and The Philippines as a radio operator and technician.

Upon his return to civilian life he attended Stanford University. He studied mathematics and art

and he received his BA and MA in education. For several years after graduation he attended Stanford during the summer studying painting and sculpture.

Charles happily devoted over 50 years to teaching mathematics in Redwood City at McKinley School, Sequoia High School and Cañada College.

Although, he was mainly a water colorist, he also painted in acrylics and oil. Charles had one man shows at the California Legion of Honor, Stanford Art Center, Colorado College, galleries in Connecticut and other venues. His works are mounted and displayed all over the U.S. and in many foreign countries.

He also loved music and sang and played guitar with several folk and choral groups, including the Redwood City Senior Center Choir.

All friends, family, colleagues, and former students are invited to a celebration of his life to be held at the Redwood City Veterans Memorial Senior Center, Redwood Room at Madison and Nevada Streets, on Saturday, October 6th at 2 pm.
