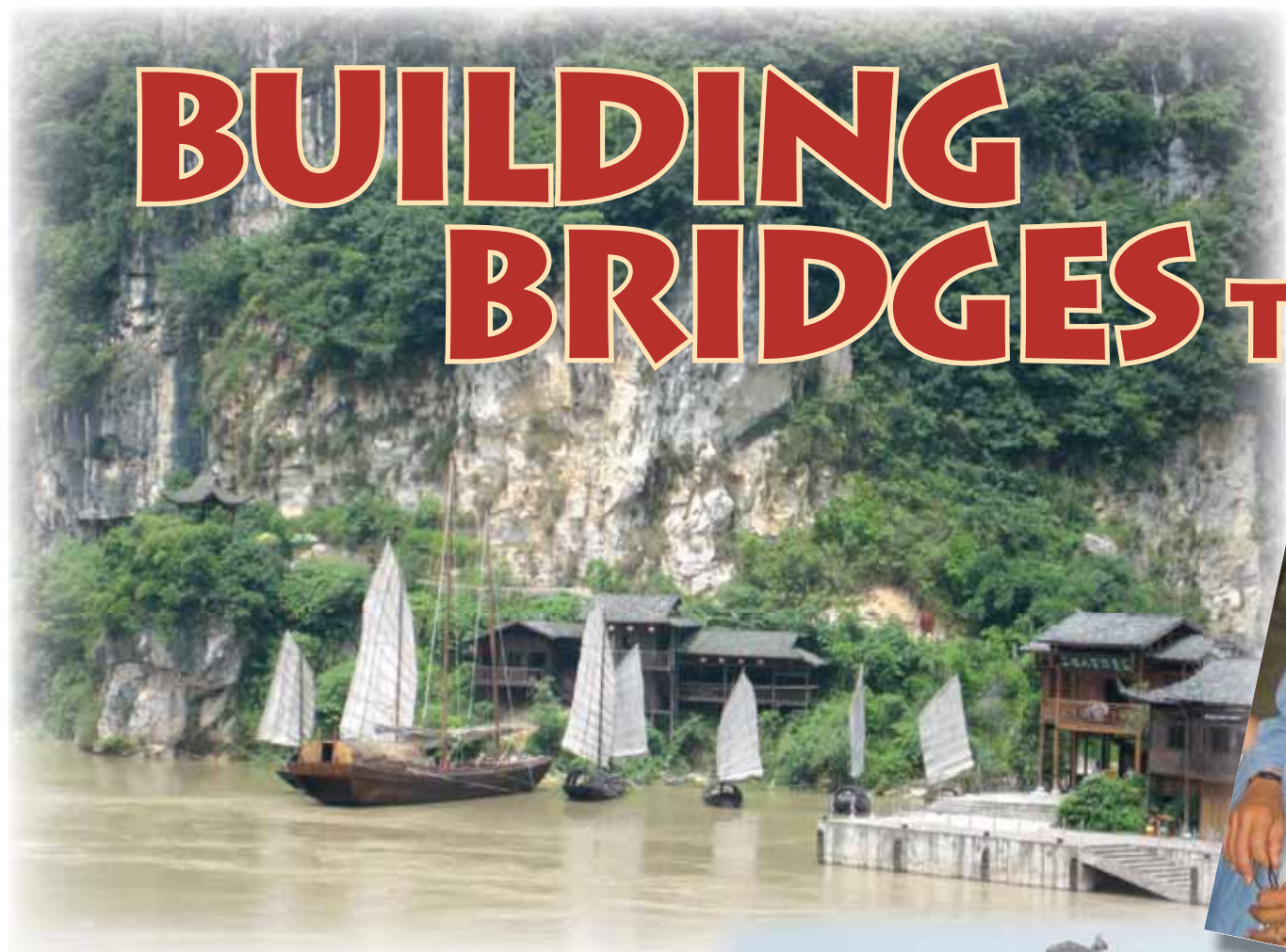


BUILDING BRIDGES TO CHINA



LAURA RICH SEES 'THE SLEEPING GIANT' AWAKENING ON U.S. EDUCATORS' TOUR

Laura Rich's 16-day trip to China in July turned out to be a complete turnabout from her visit in 1981 as a college student on "Semester at Sea."

"China is the fastest-evolving country in the world right now," said Ms. Rich, trustee and former president of the Menlo Park City School District Board. The prediction: By 2012, China will be the largest English-speaking country in the world.

"It's no longer the concrete jungle and sea of people of 26 years ago, when everyone wore gray Mao jackets and pants, rode bicycles everywhere, and most decisions were made by the government," she said. "China has come alive; it's more like us."

Cities are flourishing with multi-story buildings. People, especially the younger ones, wear colorful clothing. Flowers, billboards, store fronts and restaurants are everywhere. There's even an emerging "food culture," and independent vendors are making and selling food on the streets.

Ms. Rich was invited to China as a member of this year's China Bridge Delegation of 800 educators from the U.S. and 200 from Korea. The program is sponsored by Hanban, a division of China's educational ministry in conjunction with the U.S. College Board. The goal: to build a bridge of understanding between the countries, and support the teaching of Mandarin in the U.S.

The entire group spent four days in Beijing and followed a jam-packed schedule: visiting primary and secondary schools, and attending a symposium about how to establish a Chinese-language program and a lecture

on Chinese language and culture at Peking University.

Built into the schedule were visits to the Forbidden City and the Great Wall, and a special cultural performance at the Beijing Exhibition Center Theatre.

"We were housed in modern, beautiful hotels, and each person had their own room; some had suites," she said. Greeting them were beautiful gift boxes with fruit, a T-shirt and a book with an electronic pen to help them learn Mandarin.

Getting the 1,000 delegates from one spot to the next via a string of buses was a major logistics operation and stopped traffic along the route.

After Beijing, Ms. Rich and a smaller group of delegates spent the next four days in Harbin, the northernmost city in China, with a population of more than 10 million, near the Russian border. Here they visited primary and secondary schools, and had some time for sightseeing and shopping.

"I didn't see anyone wearing a gray Mao jacket during the 16 days," said Ms. Rich.

After the formal visit, Ms. Rich and delegate-friends from the Peninsula took an independent eight-day tour, seeing the terra cotta warriors, unearthed at Xi'an; cruising along the Yangtze River; and enjoying rural scenes, more like "old China."

Serious about education

School in China is serious business, Ms. Rich observed. Students go to school Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., with an hour and a half off to go home for dinner, and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Then there's homework.

"I have homework every night and do homework until one in the morning," a student at a middle school told Ms. Rich.

During recess, Ms. Rich noted, all students file out in an orderly fashion to the paved area at the same time. "They don't play ball, but do calisthenics" as a group, she said. There isn't time for free play.

ers' aides or parent volunteers in the classrooms.

Staff development for teachers is built around "harmony" — having harmonious relationships, she said. Teachers emphasize the values of honesty, bravery, inquisitiveness and diligence.

At one of the multi-story primary schools, there was a "moral education office" and a "party branch office."

Young people are excited about the changes and more opportunities in today's more affluent China, said Ms. Rich. But many of the older people are unhappy and more comfortable with what was. They don't understand the changes.

Their main concern, she said, stems from the fact that they watched what happened to Russia with the break-up of the Soviet Union, and they want China to remain as one country.

Ms. Rich said little was mentioned about China's "one child policy," which now enables a family to have a second child if they pay the equivalent of a one time \$750 fine, which is still "a big deal." One of the tour leaders related that his father, a college professor, after paying the rent and food bill each month had only \$2 left in discretionary income.

"Anyone taking care of Western travelers takes on a Western name, such as Jennifer as in Jennifer Anniston," Ms. Rich noted. She made an effort to learn their given names.

She learned that one young woman's name was Ai Chin and asked what it meant. "Chin means treasure" was the reply.

A beautiful name, but it comes with a heavy burden. She was her parents' second child and cost her family their treasure. Now she has the pressure of "living a life worthy of her family's sacrifice," Ms. Rich said.

While the Chinese are fascinated with what's going on in the United States, they don't ask questions, Ms. Rich said. During the 16 days of the trip, only one student asked a question: "I don't understand why you send your soldiers out in the world?"

Ms. Rich said that to the Chinese government, it's very important to reach out to the rest of the world, and have other countries understand China's economy and culture. The hope is others will learn Mandarin and be able to communicate with 1.3 billion people. ■

She and the delegates enjoyed some amazing student performances — dances, plays, opera and music — during their visit, she said. Especially memorable, she added, was a performance of the thousand-hand Bodhisattva, to music by high school students who are deaf. (From Tibetan Buddhism, a Bodhisattva is someone who is motivated by pure compassion and love to help others.)

"Schools are huge," said Ms. Rich. The K-5 school she visited in Beijing had 4,000 students. The smallest one in Harbin had 2,000 students. The smallest class size was 45 students, but most teachers had classes of 75. There weren't any teach-
