John Sakrison of Menlo Park specializes in the care and feeding of VCs (venture capitalists)

Trained as a professional chef, John Sakrison of Menlo Park wears many hats, besides a chef's toque.

In 2002 he and his wife, Carla, purchased Quadrus Conference Center and Catering on Saga Lane, just off Sand Hill Road. Today he juggles operating Quadrus Cafe, scheduling events in the conference center, and sending out vans to cater to the needs of venture capitalists, the denizens of "Wall Street West."

Sand Hill Road is just the route to Woodside, Portola Valley or Stanford Shopping Center for most of us, but Mr. Sakrison knows it as the venture capital center of the

world. "There are billions of dollars involved on the street (Sand Hill Road)," he says.

Venture capitalists and Stanford University are Quadrus Conference Center's biggest clients.

Partners' day

Mr. Sakrison's job calls for 12-hour days, but "Mondays are really crazy," he says. "I'm here at 5:30 a.m." The reason is that Monday is partners' day. Venture capital partners gather for their weekly meeting, which is usually followed by a substantial lunch.

"The food goes to them. They don't go to the food," says Mr. Sakrison. He sends three catering vans out filled with chafing dishes of food to be served buffet style.

Some firms provide not only a Monday lunch but a Quadrus-catered meal five times a week. Lunch might be a "gourmet deli buffet," which includes filet mignon, portobello mushrooms and oven-roasted turkey, or "anything with guacamole." On-site lunches are preferred because they add to productivity and provide privacy, says Mr. Sakrison.

There are a few no-no's for VC lunches: no bones, no skin, no shellfish, no food requiring use of hands, no raw onions and light on the garlic. Roast chicken is one of Mr. Sakrison's favorite foods, but only boneless, skinless chicken breasts are served in the catered lunches. Dessert is usually cookies or fruit.

Big names and big money are part of the Sand Hill Road mystique. Mr. Sakrison is discreet about his clients, but does admit cooking for Dick Cheney, Al Gore, and Colin Powell. Barack Obama recently attended an event at the conference center and a private luncheon was served off-site for Hillary Clinton.

The center's Web site quotes Al Gore as saying the hilltop site is "one of the most beautiful conference centers I've ever been to." Nestled on an oak-studded hilltop, Quadrus Conference Center also displays one of the finest private art collections in the country, the Anderson Collection. How many

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conference rooms can boast massive artworks by Frank Serra on their walls?

The center's doors open onto a deck overlooking the Sharon Heights hills, with Stanford's Hoover Tower in the distance.

Mr. Sakrison likes many aspects of his job, including the commute. "I can walk or bike to work," he says. He and his wife bought their home in Sharon Heights three years ago.

The Quadrus complex was the first office development to be built along Sand Hill Road in the 1960s. It was built on 21 acres by Saga Foods, a company that provided food service to colleges and universities throughout the United States. Saga was purchased by the Marriott Corporation in 1986. The next year the corporation buildings were sold to the Henry J. Kaiser Foundation and renamed Quadrus.

Quadrus Cafe

What was once the Saga test kitchen is now Quadrus Cafe. It serves as a convenient lunch spot for complex employees, but is also

open to the public. Employees from SLAC and nearby offices and Sharon Heights neighbors often drop in.

The large menu offers soups and salads, pastas and entrees, sandwiches and desserts. The tostada salad (\$11.25), Chinese chicken salad (\$9.50), and chicken salad with field greens, pecans, apples and currants (\$10.75) are customer favorites.

"Protein-protein-protein" (with a nod to the Atkins diet) is a selection of grilled chicken and salmon, served with cottage cheese, fruit salad, and mixed nuts (\$13). Persian chicken kebabs with vegetables and hummus are \$12.50.

Mr. Sakrison, who has cooked at Restaurant Lulu in San Francisco and Stars in Oakville, gets to show his creativity at dinners and receptions in the conference center. One of his show stoppers is a mashed potato bar. Four kinds of potatoes (white truffle oil-flavored, roasted garlic, Yukon gold, pesto) are scooped into martini glasses and served with a variety of toppings: caramelized onions, creme fraiche, chives, mushrooms, bacon and cheese.

Another knockout presentation is dim sum, featuring several kinds of dumplings and stuffed crab claw.

Sharon Heights Homeowners president

Sharon Heights residents were treated to these goodies and more at the recent Sharon Heights Homeowners Association Christmas party hosted by Mr. Sakrison. He has been the association's president for the past two years.

The Sakrison's are typical of many of the younger couples moving into Sharon Heights. They have two small children, ages 2 and 6. "We're trying to rebuild the association and get the new people involved," he says.

On weekends when the pressure lets up at Quadrus, Mr. Sakrison sometimes cooks at home. He often fixes roast chicken. "I start it out at 400 degrees for 15 minutes, then lower the heat to 325 degrees. I like to put fresh herbs (thyme or marjoram) and lemon slices under the (breast) skin." He picks the Meyer lemons from trees in his backyard.

Come Monday morning, however, he's back at Quadrus before dawn, pulling muffins out of the oven for an early morning breakfast meeting, checking out the catering trucks as they head down to Sand Hill, and generally seeing to it that his VC clients will eat well during the coming week.

"I have a lot of pride in taking care of the VCs," he says. ■

New owners for Oak City Bar & Grill

Oak City Bar & Grill, which has been a hit with local diners for the past five years, has been sold. Former owner David King has sold the business to Hakan Cildir and Mehmet Erkus. The men have been friends since school days in their native Turkey.

Mr. Erkus has 10 years of experience in the restaurant business in San Mateo and Burlingame. Mr. Cildir has worked as a Realtor and in the hotel industry.

The new owners say the menu will stay the same, but they plan to expand the already extensive wine list. They will also introduce a happy hour Mondays and Thursdays and be open for dinner at 5 p.m.

Kerry Anne Dolan, who has been with the restaurant since it opened, will stay on as executive chef. She also worked with celebrity chef Joey Altman when he operated Wild Hare restaurant in the same location.

Popular items from the Oak City menu include butternut squash soup, sake-steamed mussels, roasted beet salad, "mac and cheese" gratin, pan-roasted salmon, and Heath Bar crunch brownie sundae.

Oak City Bar & Grill is located at 1029 El Camino Real in Menlo Park. It is open daily for dinner and Monday through Friday for lunch. For more information, call 321-6882.

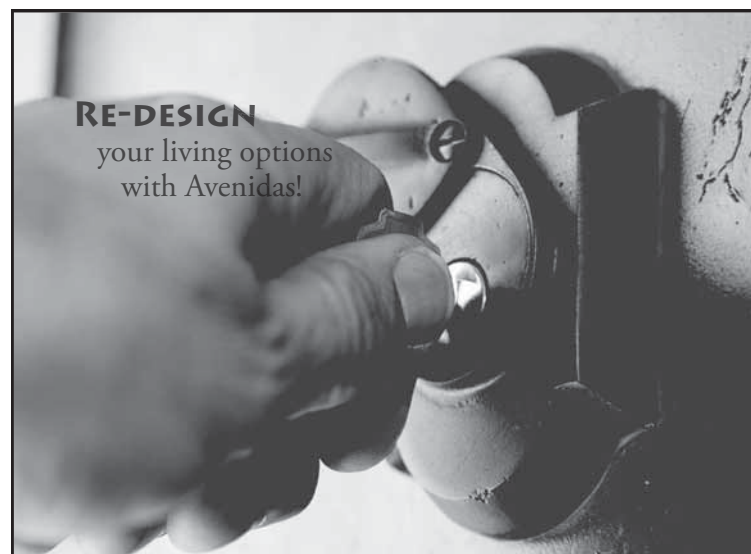

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A Currant affair

Red Currant Bistro serves Mediterranean food with a flair

The Red Currant, the new restaurant at Allied Arts Guild in Menlo Park, is serving innovative food in a long-time landmark.

The bistro is located in the former site of Allied Arts Restaurant, which was operated for 75 years by the Palo Alto Auxiliary to Lucile Packard Children's Hospital.

The food at the Red Currant is excellent but different from fare the auxiliary members served and helped prepare. For example, the breakfast menu now features shakshuka. It's a Middle Eastern egg dish (\$12.50) served three ways: American, with potato, onion and bacon; Greens, with spinach, zucchini and feta cheese; and Mediterranean, with red peppers and tomatoes.

On a recent visit to the Red Currant, I was able to order the Mediterranean shakshuka for lunch. The eggs were baked in an individual cast iron skillet and served in a spicy sauce.

My dining partner had the schnitzel (\$15.75), chicken breast served on celery root-potato puree with sauteed onions and coleslaw. The two large pieces of chicken were fine. The potatoes could have been warmer and the coleslaw needed more seasoning, she said.

We split a luscious apple-pear



crisp with vanilla ice cream (\$7.50).

Returning last week, I opted for the most exotic item on the lunch menu, a Middle Eastern platter of hummus, tabbouleh salad, and sweet potato falafel with house-made flat bread (\$12.75). The bright green salad was scattered with pomegranate seeds; I couldn't taste sweet potato in the crunchy falafel but it had lots of flavor.

My table mates liked the grilled portobello sandwich served on house-made focaccia, which came with a sprightly green salad (\$13.25). All the servings are generous.

We sampled a decadent chocolate hazelnut mousse with chocolate sauce and a delicious meringue topped with berry sauce and thick whipped cream for dessert. We agreed the house-made desserts are one of the best things about the new bistro.

The menu has many choices: roasted beet salad, hanger steak medallions, pan-seared sea bass, gnocchi, and several kinds of sandwiches. For the less adventurous, there is Caesar salad and a turkey sandwich.

Along with a new menu, the Red Currant has made several

changes: Unlike the auxiliary's restaurant, it is open on Saturdays, serves breakfast as well as lunch, does not require reservations (except for six or more), and takes credit cards.

The bistro is open Monday through Saturday. Luncheon is served from noon to 3 p.m. Breakfast is served from 10 a.m. to noon. Along with shakshuka, the breakfast menu includes a continental breakfast; eggs served any style with olives, cheese, and vegetable salad; and muesli with fruit and yogurt. There are also house-made pastries, including chocolate orange marzipan cake (\$4.50).

Red Currant's proprietors are Nir and Ayellet Perry, a young Israeli couple who own Cassis Catering Company in Redwood City. Their small staff is hard-working and eager to please.

I miss the cozy atmosphere the restaurant used to have. The room begs for some color to brighten the dark tables and chairs, especially on a winter day.

I hope diners who have fond memories of lunch at Allied Arts will give the Red Currant a try. The proprietors are working hard to give their customers a new dining experience. ■

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Stanford paper names new home after Lokey

Atherton resident and philanthropist Lorry Lokey will lend his name to the new home of the Stanford Daily, the student newspaper.

The Daily reports that the new building, to be named the Lorry Lokey Stanford Daily Building, will be located next to the Old Union in the center of campus and will include workspaces and offices behind the typical Stanford facade of stucco walls and wood-framed windows.

The two-story, tile-roof building

will cover 5,400 square feet; the construction budget is \$3.75 million. Stanford's board of trustees told the Daily that it expects the building to be completed by October.

An article in the Daily notes that Mr. Lokey was the editor of the paper during his tenure at Stanford

and has subsequently supported the paper through journalism grants and scholarships.

Top finishes for Menlo duo

Marcus Talbott and Brian Francis, both of Menlo Park, finished among the top four at the recent Far West giant slalom ski race at Northstar at Tahoe. In a slalom race, skiers zigzag between obstacles as they descend the hill.

Brian and Marcus finished third and fourth respectively on Jan. 12 and then switched podiums on Jan. 13. They beat out approximately 80 other young skiers over the sunny but cold weekend.

Then, on Jan. 26, at a slalom race at Diamond Peak ski resort, Brian placed third after the day's two runs.

These were the first races of the California and Nevada division of the U.S. Ski and Snowboard Association 2007-2008 season for skiers age 12 and 13.

Both boys were selected to compete in an upcoming qualifying

race to be held in Mammoth on Feb. 23. This race pits the top 15 racers in the state against each other to determine the three skiers that will go on to compete at the Junior Olympics Ski Race in March.

Slalom skiing is a fast and difficult sport, and both boys finished within two and half seconds of the winning time. Their finishes were all the more impressive because the boys were competing against kids from the Tahoe area who can train five days a week, noted Bonnie Matlock, Brian's mother.

Brian, a La Entrada School seventh-grader, has been traveling to the snow on weekends to train with the Kirkwood Ski Race Team since he was 7, said Ms. Matlock. Brian says he plays soccer in the off-season to stay in shape, but last summer he got the opportunity to ski in New Zealand for a month.

Marcus is a sixth-grader at Woodside Priory School and has been skiing with the Northstar Ski Race Team since he was 6. The boys used to play on the same Little League baseball team, and the families have been good friends for years. Ms. Matlock added.

The regular season ends with the championships at Northstar at Tahoe April 27-30.

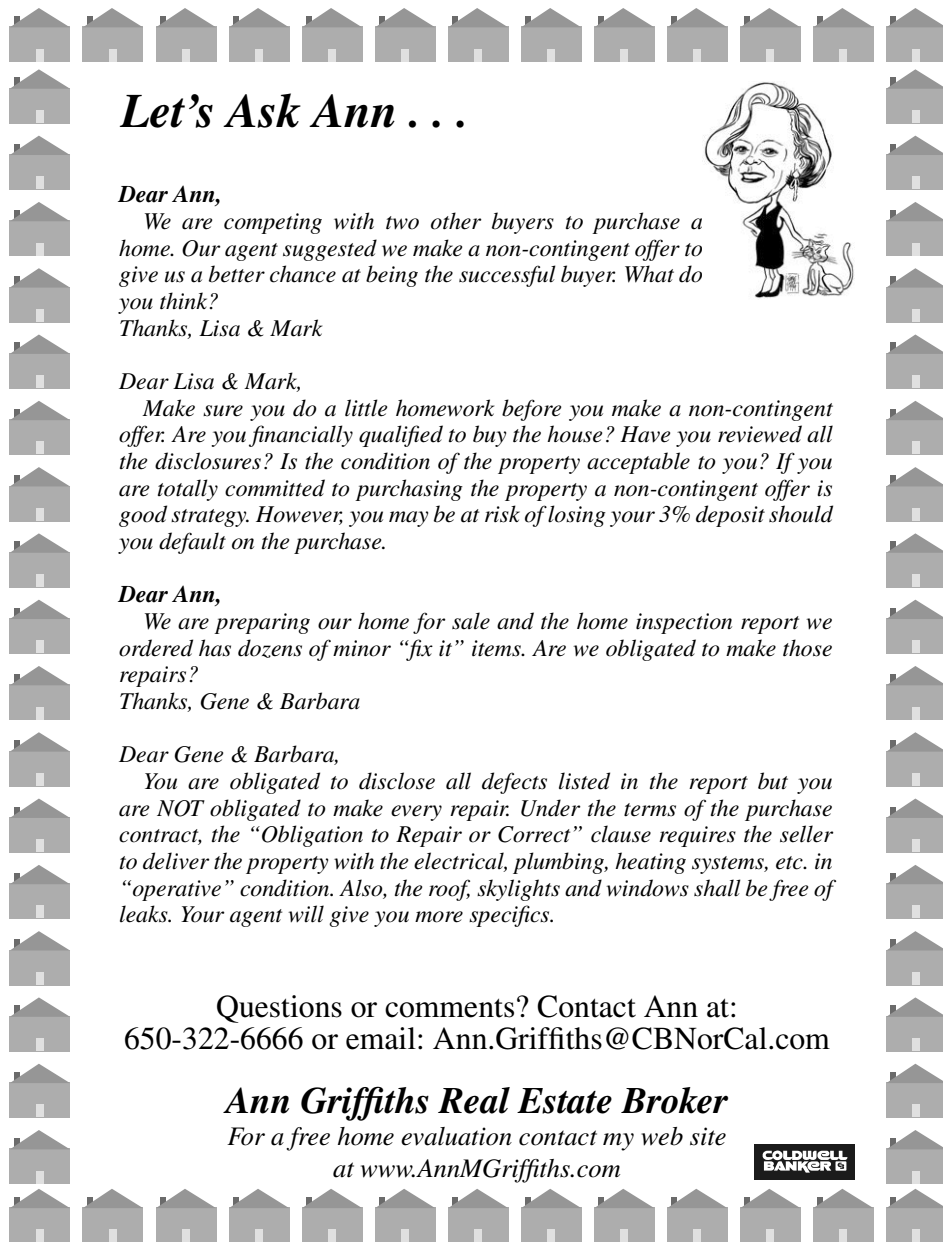

However, you may be at risk of losing your 3% deposit should you default on the purchase.

Dear Ann,

We are preparing our home for sale and the home inspection report we ordered has dozens of minor "fix it" items. Are we obligated to make those repairs?

Dear Gene & Barbara,

You are obligated to disclose all defects listed in the report but you are NOT obligated to make every repair. Under the terms of the purchase contract, the "Obligation to Repair or Correct" clause requires the seller to deliver the property with the electrical, plumbing, heating systems, etc. in "operative" condition. Also, the roof, skylights and windows shall be free of leaks. Your agent will give you more specifics.

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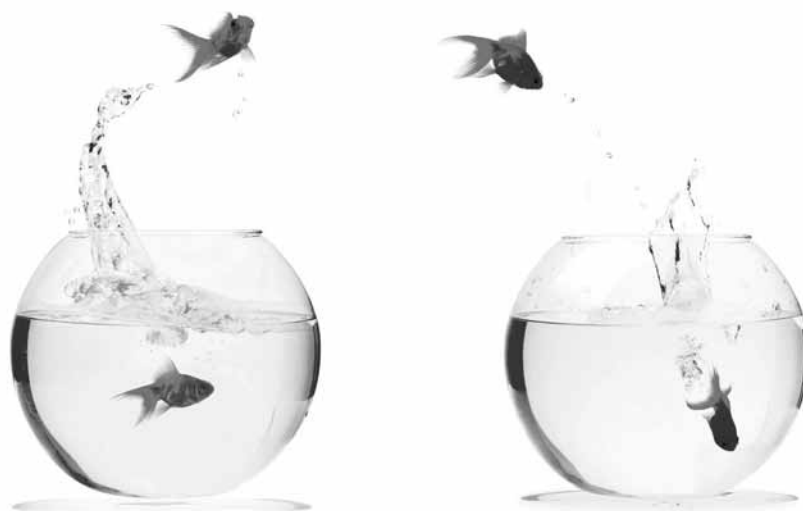
