I'm not sure why I wasn't more emotional as I recently watched my eldest child walk across the platform in a cap and gown to accept the handshake that stands in for a diploma these days.

This was the big one — college graduation. With her bachelor's degree in graphic design, Caitlin is now equipped to go out into the real world, get a job and support herself; leave home

and not have her credit card bills sent to her father. She plans to relocate to New York City and wants to work for a magazine's design department.

Maybe it was because we were sitting high up in the nosebleed seats in the San Diego State basketball stadium and the only way we could tell it was Caitlin was by looking through the camera's zoom lens. It helped that she had thoughtfully applied her name across her cap in glitter paint.

As the students filed into the stadium, a strange thing happened. Cell phones to ears, the graduates stood up and started waving. It soon became clear that they were calling their friends and relatives, trying to figure out where they were in the massive stadium.

We found Caitlin this way, also, but then lost her when she sat down because she was so far away and had recently dyed her hair a color not as easy to spot as her natural red.

I also might have been a little numb because the drive the day before, with my mom and one of my sisters who had come from Oregon to witness this momentous event, had taken 11 hours.

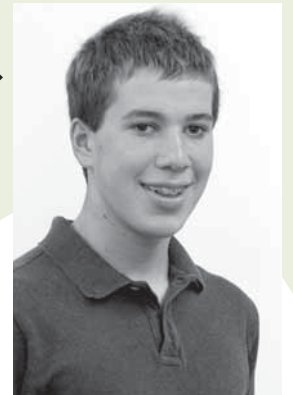

Woodside Village Church is hosting a day of free concerts — La Fete de la Musique (commonly known as World Music Day) — on June 21, the summer solstice.

An afternoon of hour-long concerts, starting at 1 p.m., is scheduled for the church courtyard at 3154 Woodside Road. An evening concert begins at 8 p.m. inside the church.

Scheduled to perform first is guitarist Simon Dray, a resident of Redwood City and native of France. At 1 p.m., Mr. Dray will begin a jazz set; at 2 p.m., he will perform a tribute to the popular French chanteur Jacques Brel, said Mark Adams, the music director at Woodside Village Church.

Up next at 3 p.m. is Pasquale, keyboardist and singer of Italian folk songs. Peninsula resident, guitarist and singer Garrick Davis closes out the afternoon performing blues, funk and folk.

There may be homegrown

music as well. "If people want to bring their own instruments and kind of continue the love after 5 p.m., they're certainly welcome to do that," Mr. Adams said.

The evening concert begins with a recital of French and Italian opera and classical songs, with organist Jessie Jewitt, soprano Rebecca Magi and Mr. Adams singing tenor.

After a 15 minute intermission, the concert concludes with Faure's Requiem. Ms. Jewitt will perform

the music, and Ms. Magi and Mr. Adams will sing accompanied by volunteers from local choirs.

A French tradition

La Fete de la Musique began in France in 1982 at the behest of the Ministry of Culture, according to the festival's Web site.

The festival's original purpose was to take live music to places where it might otherwise not be heard, and to encourage interactions among musicians of all ages and skill levels.
