

We left at 2 p.m. to "miss the traffic" but since it was the Friday before Memorial Day weekend, the traffic was impossible to miss.

For the first time in my life I experienced the infamous Pacheco Pass backup. Then, when we neared Los Angeles it began pouring rain so hard that even with the wipers going full blast I couldn't really see clearly. So we were lucky that only once did a traffic accident close down

all the lanes in front of us.

I drove the entire 11 hours, since my mom and sister hate to drive in California, and we arrived at the hotel at 1 a.m.

I may also have been a bit jet-lagged since it had been less than three days since my husband and I arrived home from a 10-day trip to Europe. I spent the one day between our return and departing for San Diego doing laundry and touring Filoli with my mom and sister, who otherwise might have felt they were being ignored.

But what I really believe is that I'm still waiting for the moment when I'll really know Caitlin is moving on to the next phase of her life — when she gets a job offer!

For now she's at home, working odd jobs and trying to save enough money to get that first apartment in New York, and then, we all hope, that job.


