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TAKING THE KIDS TO WORK

Cubes & Crayons mixes 'coworking' with child care

The challenge is eating the cake and still having it. In this case, the cake is a red velvet career with a corner office and fulfilling work, all mixed up with angel food family life with children, a minivan, and violin recitals.

For many professional women, this confection seems like an impossibility. Cubes & Crayons has come to downtown Menlo Park to change that, says founder M. Felicity Chapman, who launched the business in January.

The company, on Crane Street off of Santa Cruz Avenue, is the intersection of two trends: flexible child care and "coworking."

The coworking movement, in which independent professionals gather to work in a communal office, has grown in global popularity — popping up everywhere from Madrid to Melbourne.

The difficulty of being a parent while maintaining and advancing a career has led a number of companies on the Peninsula, such as Google and Cisco, to offer on-site child care for employees. Cubes & Crayons uses the coworking model to give freelancers and people who work at home a professional office, and adds to it child care just down the hall.

Ms. Chapman says the idea came to her after her first daughter, Kaia, was born and she faced the problem of being a mother and continuing to work.

Three years after the idea was hatched, Cubes & Crayons opened its doors with seed money from Ms. Chapman and her husband. It has yet to break even, but Ms. Chapman expects it will be profitable by August.

'Office space, kids' space'

Walking up the stairs to Cubes & Crayons, you will find a few classic features of the office environment: bare rooms with simple tables and chairs, a kitchenette, a bulletin board, a printer and copier, sound-proof ceiling tiles, and fluorescent lighting. There are three coworking offices, and two conference rooms that can double as coworking space when they're empty. A lounge area houses workshops and events.

You'll also find some hints that Ms. Chapman used to

have an interior design firm: the same tiffany blue and teal color combination is on everything from the walls to the informational brochures and the labels on the bulletin board. She also has her favorite inspirational quotes printed on the walls, such as: "Nothing happens until we first dream."

Go past the child-safe gate, and you'll find two nap rooms and a big child care area with trains and wooden toys, books, and wholesome music playing from the stereo. The color scheme is broken in this room, which has purple walls. "Purple fosters creativity," Ms. Chapman says.

There are also some things you won't find when you visit Cubes & Crayons. Despite the name, you won't find cubicles, only office rooms.

You also won't find a television or any electronic toys because Ms. Chapman, who has a master's degree in education, believes that children need to be engaged in order to develop. "I would like us to be thought of as one of the best places for your child to get care, and I think we are."

Another striking absence is Ms. Chapman herself. Although she and her kids stop in about once a week for meetings, generally she's found that clients want to stop and chat, so she doesn't get any work done. Ironically, Ms. Chapman says she may eventually need to hire a part-time nanny.

Looking forward

So far, the company has about 60 regular members, although Ms. Chapman says members have been a bit slow to come in. At \$22.50 an hour for non-members, using the space and the child care is not cheap.

Members pay \$149 annually for access to the online reservation system and discounted rates — as low as \$13 an hour depending on the age of the child and the number of hours each month.

Palo Alto resident Victoria Coniglio-McKinney, for one, likes the set-up so much she's made Cubes & Crayons her full-time office, and even printed business cards with the company's address. "I've found a way to go to an office every

day, be with my child all day, and keep my career intact," she explains. She speaks highly of the office amenities and the child care for her 9-month-old, Isabella McKinney.

She also loves that the location allows her to take walks and do errands during lunch, although with the office in downtown Menlo Park, she says, "parking is a bit of a problem."

The social networking aspect of the shared office space hasn't been exactly what Ms. Chapman expected, but sometimes people chat in the kitchenette. The socializing, she believes, will come the longer the company stays in the area.

Three more of her Cubes & Crayons branches are in the works in the Bay Area: in San Francisco, Marin, and the South Bay. "I've always thought of this as a national company," she says, "because I think everybody should have this."

However, Ms. Chapman acknowledged that Silicon Valley is a particularly appropriate place to pilot the company, both because local people are willing to try out new ideas, and because blogging and telecommunication, both activities that Cubes & Crayons accommodates and encourages, are already practiced widely in the community.

Ms. Chapman says she has a big folder of ideas for startup companies, and plans to take Cubes & Crayons to a certain stage of development and then hand it off to be maintained and built by someone else.

In the meantime, the Menlo Park office seems to be doing well. "It just shouldn't be so difficult to have a family and live your life," Ms. Coniglio-McKinney says. "For some reason this problem just hasn't been solved; maybe this is finally the turning point for solving it."

If Cubes & Crayons expands and membership grows, the model it pioneers will be tested on a larger scale. ■

Locals win Junior Team squash cups

The 2008 California Junior Squash Elite Team — featuring seven top student athletes from Menlo Park, Atherton and Woodside — traveled recently to Seattle, where they trounced the competition and won both divisional Champion's Cups at the 2008 Invitational West Coast Junior Team Squash Championships.

The annual three-day tournament was held May 9-11 at the Seattle Athletic Club, where about 75 of the top Western junior American and Canadian squash players competed on teams from California, Washington, and British Columbia.

The 18-player "Team California" contingent fielded a Division I team and two Division II teams. The elite junior team was sponsored by Harrow Sports and the Northern California

Team California's Division I team, led by team captain Todd Lavine of Atherton, won the Saunders Cup in a very close, round-robin competition. The team featured stellar play by Lavine and Woodside's Milo Watanabe, who went undefeated during the weekend, and the one-two tandem punch of brothers William and Leonard Mohr of Menlo Park. The team was co-coached by their father, Doug Mohr.

Team California's Division II team, led by young squash phenom Gabriel Morgan of Menlo Park, won the Yusuf Khan Cup in decisive fashion. Morgan's team won 20 straight matches, finishing with a won-lost game

record of 65-4.

Morgan, 10, a fourth-grade student at St. Raymond School and member of the Olympic Club in San Francisco, went undefeated and was never seriously challenged during the weekend. Morgan is ranked No. 1 in the U.S. in the Boys Under 11 junior squash division, according to U.S. Squash, the sport's governing body. The winning Division II team was coached by his father, M. Reynolds Morgan.

Amit Sankaran, a student at St. Joseph's School in Atherton, and Woodside Priory's Drew Lavine, younger brother to Todd Lavine, were members of a second California Division II team that also did well at the tournament. Sankaran and Lavine played strong throughout the tournament and helped their team battle for third place honors in a very competitive eight-team division.

Chloe said she has worked with the horse rescue group for many years, saving her own money to donate to it.

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Woodside school suspends Spanish for grades 1-4

Primary grade students at Woodside Elementary School will get extra time for music and physical education next year because they won't be taking Spanish classes.

The Woodside school board voted to suspend its twice-a-week Spanish lessons for grades 1-4 following last month's resignation of Spanish teacher Maria Teresa Magaña. The vote was 5-0 at the board's July 15 special meeting.

Board members said they wanted to take some time to rethink the program before reintroducing it, possibly as soon as mid-school year.

The board directed district staff to work with Woodside's Parent Teacher Organization to arrange for after-school Spanish lessons to be offered in the interim.

Spanish will still be taught to middle school students.

"We are temporarily taking a break from Spanish," said board member Ellen Ablow at the meeting.

One parent at the meeting complained about Spanish lessons being compulsory for all students when he preferred to have his children focus on English skills. Having his kids acquire a foreign language is at the bottom of his list of priorities, he told the board.

Another parent said that, while he loved the idea of Spanish classes for primary-grade students, he and other parents felt their children didn't really learn any Spanish until they reached middle school.

Susan Arbuckle, a parent and school volunteer, said that the Spanish program focuses on cultural exposure and preparing students to study the language more intensely when they are older. Parents, however, expect their children to be able to order in Spanish at a restaurant or know

how to ask to go to the bathroom, she said.

"I think parents have a misconception of what kids are expected to learn," she said. "We've done a poor job of explaining (the program) to parents."

At the meeting, the board rejected a proposal put forward by Dan Vinson to only eliminate Spanish for grades 1-2. Then-superintendent Vinson put together the recommendation before his retirement in mid-June.

"Eliminating (Spanish) in grades 1-2, and having it in grades 3-4 seems arbitrary and very difficult to defend to the community," said board President Bettina Pike, who was out of town and attended the meeting via phone.

Board members directed staff to schedule a study session on the Spanish program during the coming school year. ■

School OKs new administrator post

Woodside Elementary School's lovely new administration building is somewhat under-populated these days. At the moment, the school's administration consists of newly hired principal Diana Abbati and part-time acting superintendent Tim Hanretty, who's based at the Portola Valley School District's office.

So to lend the new principal a hand, the school board authorized a new — and probably temporary — administrative position for the coming school year.

"Last year we had three full-time administrators on site," Mr. Hanretty told the school board. "Right now, we will have Ms. Abbati as the sole school administrator."

The board voted 5-0 at a special July 15 meeting to create a "dean of students-type position" for the 2008-09 school year. It's a full-time job, but only

70 percent of it will be spent in the administration building, with the remaining 30 percent spent in the classroom.

Once a new superintendent is hired, probably in time for the 2009-10 school year, there probably won't be a need for the newly created administrative position, said Mr. Hanretty.

The depletion of the administrative ranks is due to Superintendent Dan Vinson's recent retirement, the departure of vice principal Bob Sherman and the reassigning of Harlin Hansen, the director of instructional technology, from an administrative to a faculty position.

The board action approved a \$70,000 budget for the new administrative position, but it will be up to Principal Abbati to do the hiring, said board member Ellen Ablow.

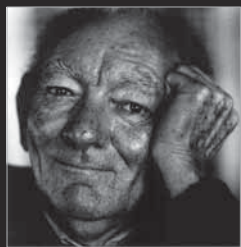

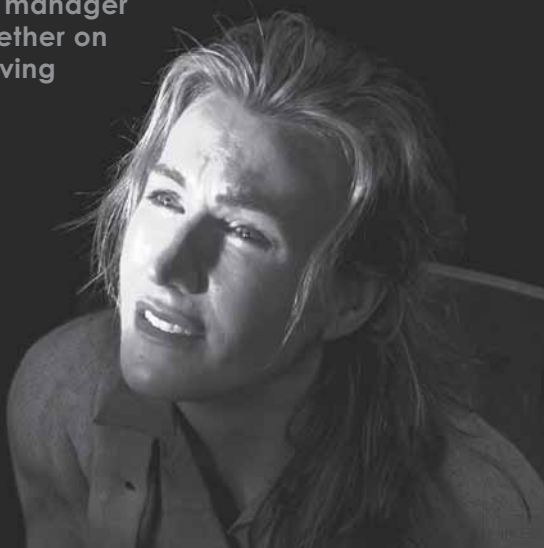

Waste agency shrinks list
to run recycling center

The South Bayside Waste Management Authority (SBWMA) is narrowing down the list of seven bidders to operate its Shoreway Recycling and Disposal Center in San Carlos starting Jan. 1, 2011.

The board will consider a recommendation to select two of the bidders for further negotiations at its meeting at 2 p.m. Thursday, July 24, in the San Carlos Library at 610 Elm St.

The two companies recommended by the selection committee for further discussions are:

■ South Bay Recycling, a joint venture based in Los Angeles that operates large recycling and transfer stations, as well as a fleet of over 60 trucks, a major composting facility, and two biomass plants producing green power.

■ Hudson Baylor Corp., a privately held company based in New York that operates 10 recycling facilities across the country processing more than 475,000 tons per year.

Allied Waste, which operates the recycling center and transfer station under a contract that expires at the end of 2010, was not one of the two bidders recommended for the short list.

Allied Waste also holds the franchise for collecting neighborhood garbage, green waste and recycling in communities, from East Palo Alto to San Bruno, served by SBWMA. That fran-

chise also expires at the end of 2010; four companies, including Allied Waste, are bidding on it. Allied Waste also owns and operates the Ox Mountain Landfill near Half Moon Bay.

Kevin McCarthy, executive director of SBWMA, noted that both of the recommended companies submitted cost proposals well below the current operating costs of Allied Waste at the recycling and disposal center. "This is great news for the taxpayers," he said.

The board of the SBWMA will consider bids for both the recycling and disposal center, and for neighborhood collection, at its meeting Thursday, Aug. 28, when it may make a decision.

The board's decision on the final operating agreement and collection franchise will need the approval of two-thirds of the 11 member agencies of SBWMA. These include Menlo Park, Atherton, East Palo Alto, Redwood City, San Mateo County, and the West Bay Sanitary District. Woodside and Portola Valley have a separate contract with Greenwaste in San Jose.

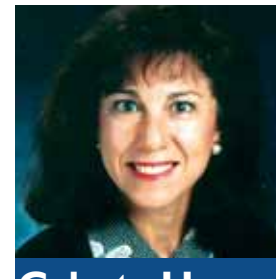


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
