Channeling clotheslines

Woodside artist makes a case for clotheslines with her art, echoing a larger environmental campaign

For some, it's the season for hanging damp clothes on a line. The humidity is low, the wind fresh and the sunshine plentiful.

Such a humble enterprise, and in line with efforts to reduce energy use, and yet the clothesline is seen as a threat. Subdivisions across the country have rules restricting their use, in part because they're thought to lower property values.

In Portola Valley, for example, they are not allowed in the ultra-high-income neighborhood of Blue Oaks and must be kept out of sight at Portola Valley Ranch, according to rules for both subdivisions. They're allowed in the Woodside Hills neighborhood in Woodside, but only if behind a fence, lattice or wall.

Clotheslines also have passionate friends,

some of whom are becoming more vocal now that the search is on for greener ways to live. Five states — Florida, Maine, Vermont, Utah and Colorado — already prohibit regulations against clotheslines, and similar efforts are under way in two or three other states, according to Alexander Lee, the New Hampshire-based founder of Project Laundry list.

California is not yet considering such laws, but Woodside resident and artist Ami Jaqua would have it otherwise. To her, clothes swaying in the wind is an art form and a good habit in the effort to arrest global warming.

Clothes dryers are a nemesis. "I think (using a dryer) is a crime in California, where we have such wonderful weather," she says, referring in a recent interview to

households that don't avail themselves of clotheslines.

Ms. Jaqua regularly air-dries her family's clothing and bedding at her Skyline Boulevard home, she says. To help spread the practice, she has spent parts of the last two years painting a series of clothesline scenes in oil on canvas and now on display in the Woodside Library.

Using Ms. Jaqua's exhibit and her concerns as a kick-off, The Almanac takes a look at this simplest of technologies and talks with crusaders for it and those who would restrict the freedom to use it.

Wind-blown fabric

Ms. Jaqua says she came to the idea of painting clothesline scenes after her electricity bill doubled one Christmas holiday when visitors came and needed to dry their clothes.

Also inspiring her were the artist Christo (and his partner Jeanne-Claude), she says. Among their works: a 14-day spectacle from the 1970s in which an 18-foot-high, 24-mile-long fence of white nylon ran

north from San Francisco through rural parts of Marin and Sonoma counties to Bodega Bay.

"He made fabric blowing in the wind an art form," Ms. Jaqua says.

Most of her paintings are based on photographs of scenes in the United States with one or two from Normandy, she says.

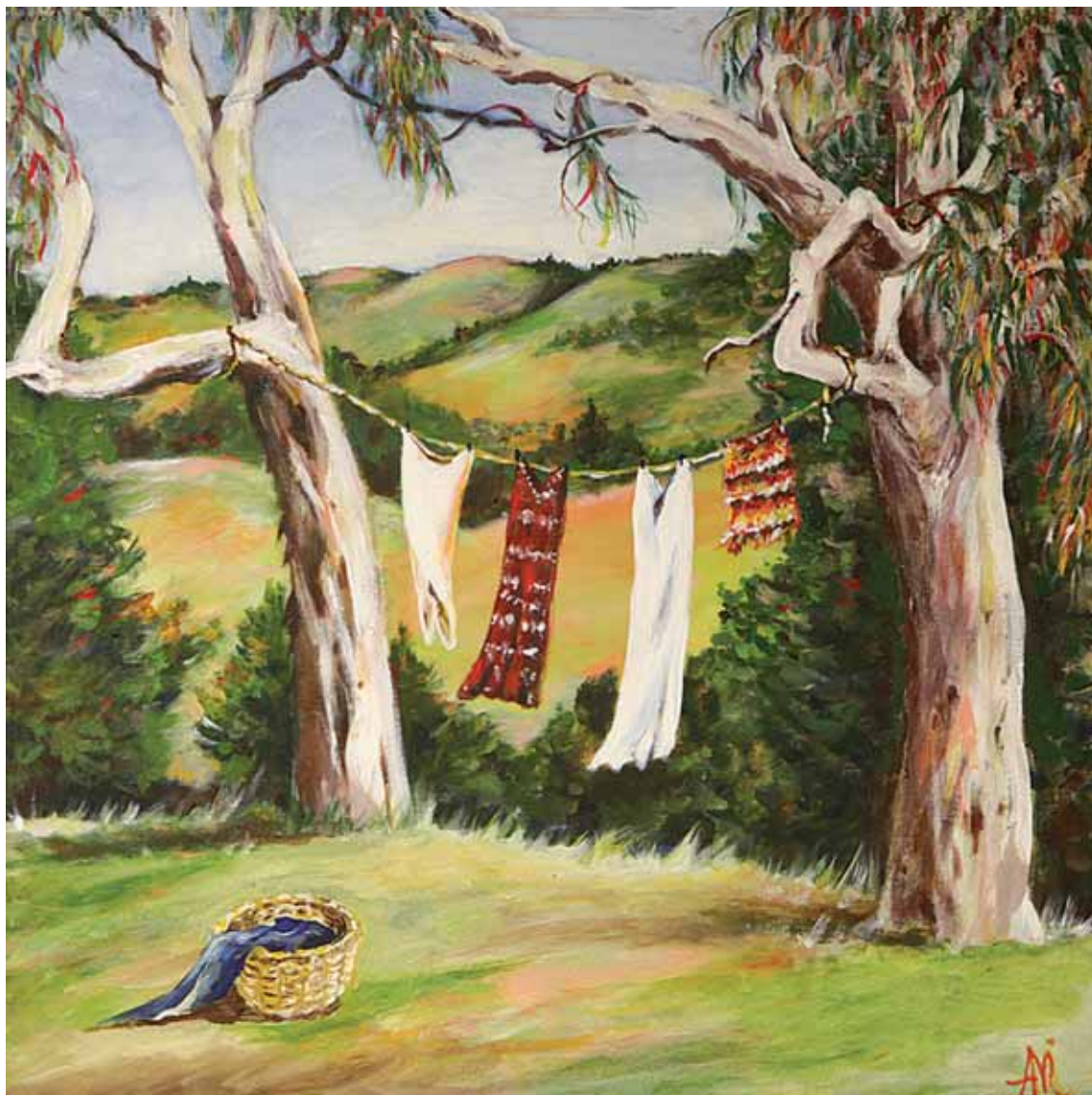

Another shows a line of Tibetan prayer flags. Some are from the country of her imagination.

One element you will not find: ghettos, slums or any other signs of impoverishment. "That's what I wanted to get away from," she says. "That symbol should be abolished."

Gray days are another no-show. Asked why, Ms. Jaqua could say only that she sees sunshine as a necessary element to drying clothes and that she painted the scenes on sunny days.

(For Portola Valley resident and all-purpose clothesline spokeswoman Danna Breen, clouds and

rain are no deterrent to hanging her clothes. "Rain-water makes them smell sweet, fresh," she says in an e-mail. "Like, really clean. I can't really describe it.")

Ms. Jaqua (her first name is pronounced Ahh-me) has a goal for her works of art: to encourage people to use clotheslines. She says she's heard that her library exhibit may have inspired "a handful" to convert from dryers.

The paintings are not for sale, and she says she has mixed feelings about their consistency, but she would like to exhibit them more, perhaps with the

sponsorship of an environmental group.

Fabric softener preferred

In California, controlling the emission of greenhouse gases generated through use of fossil fuels is high on the public's list of priorities, including for the governments and many residents in Atherton, Woodside, Portola Valley and Menlo Park.

In his April 24 Earth Day message, Gov. Arnold Schwarzenegger had this to say about clotheslines: "Did you know that just air-drying your clothes for 6 months, per person, saves 700 pounds of carbon dioxide?"

One effort to remove restrictions on California clotheslines seems to have sparked a moment of Legislative interest, but is now gathering dust.

Retired attorney Tina Rasnow, at a 2007 conference of local bar associations, introduced a resolution that would add clotheslines to solar energy devices deserving of residential easements.

The measure was controversial and passed narrowly. Ms. Rasnow says she forwarded it to an assemblyman, but with a limit on how many bills a member can introduce each session, it hasn't done well against other priorities.

"If (the governor) is serious about telling people to use clotheslines, then he has to do something about it," she says.

The governor's office did not respond to a request

The purpose of the Public Hearing is to consider a proposed increase in sewer services charges for fiscal years ending July 31, 2010, July 31, 2011, and July 31, 2012. 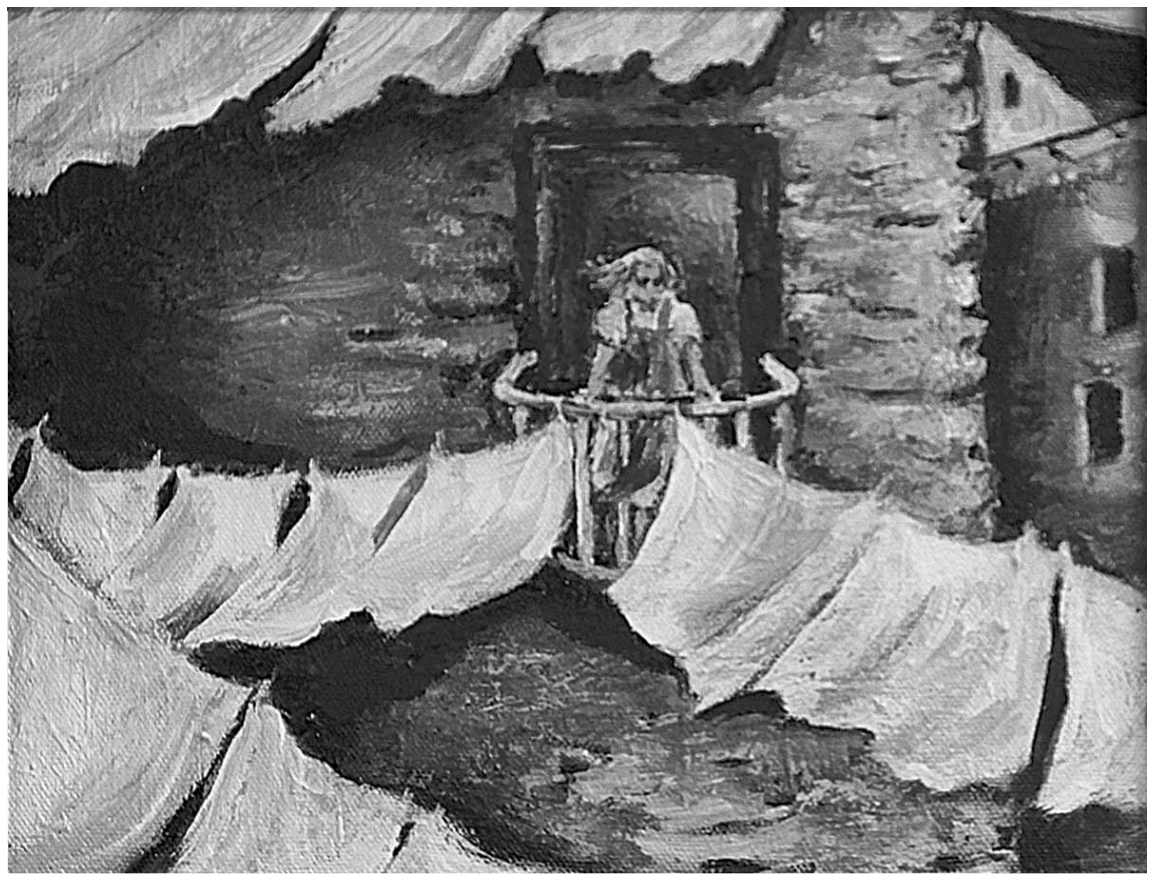

for comment by press time.

Air-drying clothes is not a problem per se, Richard S. Monson, president and chief executive of the California Association of Homeowners Associations, told The Almanac. It's having the clothes out where people can see them.

"In any neighborhood, you will find very few people putting their clothes out in public view," he says. "It's going to have an effect on the value of the property. That only stands to reason."

Mr. Monson says his family occasionally hangs clothes on a line in the garage, out of sight, and that they always dry underwear in a dryer.

Clothesline advocates claim that sun-dried clothing is bleached, disinfected, has fewer wrinkles and a scent unachievable from a dryer.

"Sunshine has a lot of properties that are phenomenal," Mr. Monson says, but he argues that line-dried sheets have a "coarser surface" and don't "smell good" like sheets dried mechanically with a fabric softener.

A serious situation

Clotheslines should not be hidden, says Helen Caldicott, a physician, leader of environmental causes, and a well-known opponent of nuclear power plants.

Indeed, Dr. Caldicott says in a phone interview from Boston, the White House should have a clothesline to go with its new

organic garden.

What about people who see clotheslines as ugly or demeaning? "What on Earth are they thinking," she says, noting the ever-rising concentration of carbon dioxide, a greenhouse gas, in the atmosphere.

"We are at a very serious situation. People have to understand what on Earth their priorities are. What's wrong with a pair of underpants" on a clothesline, she asks.

Living better electrically?

Dr. Caldicott is an adviser to Project Laundry List, a campaign begun in 1995 by Alexander Lee, who was then an undergraduate at Middlebury College in Vermont.

The project's goal: To get more people to air-dry their clothes and save energy, Mr. Lee says.

Federal Department of Energy statistics say that electric clothes dryers represent about 6 percent of household electricity use, but it would be 15 percent or 20 percent if apartments and institutions such as hospitals, prisons and nursing homes were included, he says.

An apartment dweller in New Hampshire, Mr. Lee takes his clothes to a commercial laundry then hauls them back home to line-dry them, he says.

Clotheslines are an American institution that needs reviving, he says, adding that the fascination with dryers began relatively recently, after World War II when

General Electric Corp. advertised with the slogan "Live better electrically" and had Ronald Reagan as its TV pitchman.

"Are we living better electrically?" Mr. Lee asks. Americans work more and take fewer vacations than the rest of the developed world, he says. We buy dryers that are energy-intensive to manufacture and eventually break, when for \$5, we could own clotheslines and clothes pins that don't wear out and take us outside where we can interact with neighbors and get some exercise, he says.

"It's a real shift in values that we're working for here," he says. "For a lot of people, (hanging clothes) is sort of joyous work. ... It's a different kind of work. Maybe it's a better kind of work."

Mr. Lee points out that he is pro-clothesline, not anti-dryer. Mothers with 10 kids and people with allergies need these appliances, he says.

Asked about a clothesline's negative effect on property values, he says that while he's seen no evidence of it, he is willing to account for U.S. sensibilities despite the welcome clotheslines are given in Southern and Eastern Europe, Asia, Africa and South America.

Underwear can be hung in such a way that its hidden by sheets or shirts, or hung on a drying rack inside, he says.

In Vermont, where anti-clothesline statutes are illegal, Gov. Jim Douglas personally hangs his clothes out to dry and is a "Laundry Hero," according to the Project Laundry List Web site at www.laundrylist.org. ■
