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Cafe Primavera

The new restaurant at Allied Arts is a cafe for all seasons

Cafe Primavera is the latest incarnation of the restaurant at Allied Arts. Opened just last month, it offers an appealing selection of soups, salads, sandwiches and specials.

On weekdays, the clientele is mostly “ladies who lunch,” but on Saturdays there is a lively mix of couples and families with young children enjoying themselves.

Prices are lower than those of the Red Currant, which closed after two years in the complex, and portions are generous. Service is a little uneven, but the waiters seem eager to please. Manager Maria Tachis often stops by to chat with diners and pitches in serving when things get too busy.

While the warm weather lasts, you won’t find a prettier place for lunch than the Blue Garden adjoining the restaurant. Bistro tables surround a splashing fountain in a garden planted

with hydrangeas and other blue flowers. The setting is so serene that you want to linger all afternoon.

The interior of the restaurant is rather stark. It no longer has the cozy ambience of the days when it was operated by the Palo Alto Auxiliary to Children’s Hospital — black tables and chairs beg for some color. Our hostess assured us there would be plenty of decorations for the coming holidays.

On a first visit to Cafe Primavera, two of us chose daily specials. My three lamb

chops, served on a bed of warm cabbage salad, were a bargain for \$12. One guest ordered the “grown up” grilled cheese with tomato basil soup (\$10). The cheese was nicely served on Acme bread, but there was also cheese in the soup, which seemed a little excessive.

A prawn salad (\$10) didn’t fare as well. It was six grilled prawns on top of mixed greens that looked as if they had been poured from a bag. Creamy

dressing, I think it was blue cheese, was on the side.

We got a kick out of hearing from a friend that lamb chops, prawns and tomato basil soup were also served at a private party she attended at Allied Arts the night before.

For dessert, we shared a "French purse" (\$6), a warm pastry filled with mixed berries, and a generous serving of vanilla bean gelato (\$6). Both were nicely served, with garnishes of fresh raspberries and sprigs of mint.

On another visit, my companion ordered the "Wedge BLTA" (\$12), a bountiful mix of bacon, butter lettuce, heirloom tomatoes, and avocado, with herb dressing. The roasted beet salad (\$9), served with lots of slender haricots verts, blue cheese, and orange segments, was fresh and flavorful.

We had a long wait for our slice of lemon drop bundt cake (\$6), with more of the delicious vanilla gelato.

We weren't able to eat outside on a recent Saturday, as a bridal shower was in progress on the terrace and chairs were set up in the garden for a 3:30 p.m. wedding. It was fun to sit inside and watch all the outside activity.

We both ordered sandwiches. The chicken club (\$12) was the winner. It came with tasty potato salad and had lots of nice chicken slices, lettuce, tomato, bacon, blue cheese, avocado and pesto aioli on a ciabatta roll. It was almost a flavor overload. I would've skipped the blue cheese and used mayo instead of the aioli.

My friend was disappointed in the Greek vegetarian sandwich (\$10) of feta, cucumbers, tomatoes, and artichokes, on Acme bread. She doesn't like cucumbers, and there were lots of cucumbers and very little artichoke. Neither of us cared for the kalamata olive aioli...too strong and salty.

Another Allied Arts visitor recommends the "Fish Po' Boy" (\$14). It features petrale sole, caramelized onion, lettuce, tomato and remoulade sauce on a ciabatta roll. There is also a BYOB (build your own burger, \$13). It includes 8 ounces of beef with lettuce, tomatoes, red onions, pickles and fries. Add-ons, such as cheese, avocado and bacon, are \$1 per topping.

Joanna Biondi is the proprietor of Cafe Primavera. Well known

in the Los Gatos, Saratoga, and Willow Glen areas, she has 32 years of experience in the catering business and operates two restaurants in San Jose, including one in the Tech Museum. Greg Russi is chef at Cafe Primavera at Allied Arts and Erika Garcia-Traverso is event director. ■

Cafe Primavera is open Monday through Saturday at Allied Arts Guild, 75 Arbor Road at Cambridge in Menlo Park. It is open for continental breakfast from 10 to 11:30 a.m.; for lunch, 11:30 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.; and for a light menu and afternoon tea until 5 p.m. For reservations, call 321-8810.

Don't overlook autumn's gnarly but tasty bounty

Perched upon my kitchen stool, lingering over a glass of Domenichelli petit sirah and nibbling on a bruschetta of toasted Japanese eggplant and sweet red onion, I am struck at how delightfully relaxed autumn makes me feel; it is the close to summer and the lull before the holidays.

Pumpkin patches sprout up in grocery store parking lots, and flip-flops are tossed to the back of our closets (unless you work at Abercrombie and Finch), while comfy sweaters, hot cocoa and hearty cabernets are brought front and center.

As the autumn breeze begins to bustle outside our windows and leafs silently drift from their tree branches, we say goodbye to the last few good tomatoes and hello to nubby roots and robust onions. The autumn greeting card is filled with gnarly veggies peeking over the tops of the many boxes of produce at the Sunday morning Menlo Park Farmers' Market. Autumn vegetables are earthy but light; zucchini, eggplant, Brussels sprouts, and celery are some of my favorites. They are the misunderstood vegetables, often overlooked for their more glamorous cousins such as fennel, French beans, and leeks. However, I say, give the not so popular players a chance.

Soup, risotto, chili, and pasta

become the darlings of restaurant menus, as well as my own. I've recently added one more staple to my autumn menu, and that is gnocchi (pronounced nyo-kee). These tiny pillows of potato are quick boiled in salted water, drained and dressed with a bit of Parmigiano-Reggiano and extra virgin olive oil.

Gnocchi is delicious added to soups and is a perfect partner for a myriad of autumn vegetables. Using a food processor or grater is a quick and easy preparation method.

Autumn vegetables may be easily sauteed or oven roasted, then incorporated into sauces with those "menu darlings," as a bruschetta topping, or as an autumn salad. The possibilities are endless. Just be sure to treat them like those cute and lovely summer vegetables; eat them often, while they are in season, and with good friends and even better wine.

Zucchini & Celery Gnocchi

This is a quick dish and great the next day — a little goes a long way. Serve with an apple and butter lettuce salad.

- 1 12-oz. package of gnocchi (Soporito is available in most markets)
- 1 large shallot, finely chopped
- 1 celery stalk, finely chopped
- 1 zucchini, finely grated
- 1 teaspoon chopped fresh marjoram (or 1/2 teaspoon fresh oregano)
- 1/2 cup chicken stock
- 1/2 cup cream
- 1/2 cup grated parmesan cheese (Parmigiano-Reggiano is the best)
- 10 basil leaves, sliced like ribbons
- Sea salt and white pepper to taste

1. Prepare the water for the gnocchi as per the package instructions.
2. Heat 2 teaspoons extra virgin olive oil over medium heat, saute shallot and celery until translucent and tender, about 5 minutes. Add marjoram and incorporate. Season with a few pinches of sea salt and white pepper.
3. Add chicken stock, cream, and grated zucchini, let reduce for 5 minutes.
4. Meanwhile, cook gnocchi, drain, and place in serving bowl. Keep warm.
5. Add cheese to reduced sauce and mix well. Add basil and combine. Pour over gnocchi and mix. Season with salt and pepper. Garnish with chopped Italian parsley.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Atherton City Council will hold a public hearing to consider adoption of the Comprehensive Zoning Code Update to Title 17 of the Atherton Municipal Code. CEQA Determination: Exempt per CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3)

The following substantive changes to the code were reviewed at a properly noticed public hearing during the August 19, 2009 Regular City Council meeting;

- Additional floor area for covered patios
- Exempt trellis structures from floor area calculations
- Remove the limitation on the number of kitchens in the main building and number of bathrooms in accessory structures
- Allow fountains, sculptures and small accessory structures in the front yard
- Exempt roof dormers from sidewall height limit for the main building
- Allow increased sidewall height for tower elements for the main building
- Allow bay windows on the main building to encroach two feet into the side yard in the R1-B zoning district
- Allow basement light wells on the main building to encroach into the side and rear yard in the R1-B zoning district
- Require a 20' setback for entry gates
- Eliminate the Exception Review process
- Require exterior lighting on main buildings above ten feet to be shielded or downlit
- Allow eight feet tall fences along interior property lines

The following additional changes have been incorporated into the code;

- Allow bay windows on the main building to encroach two feet into the side yard located on lots with an area less than 10,000 square feet in the R1-A zoning district
- Allow basement light wells to encroach into the required side and rear yards for main buildings located on lots with an area less than 10,000 square feet in the R1-A zoning district
