

# On the air

How students created a radio station at Sacred Heart Prep

As a high school freshman with a passing interest in radio, Alex Mitchell couldn't have known that, by his senior year, he would be the founder and president of KSHS Radio, a student-run radio station at Sacred Heart Preparatory in Atherton.

It's the only fully student-run high school radio station on the Peninsula, he says, and is the product of four years of hard work by Alex and his colleagues.

Though Alex knew nothing about radio broadcasting as a freshman, he and KSHS co-founder Tim Lewis thought creating a station might be fun and approached SHP's dean of students with the idea. They weren't met with opposition, but they found there was no protocol in place for securing funding and faculty support.

Determined to move forward, Alex and Tim hired radio engineer Harry Hall (a host on KCSM 91.1-FM) to help them establish a budget proposal and outline a plan. By the end of the co-founders' sophomore year, SHP's Senior Activities Committee had approved the station's budget.

"Things were kind of moving along," Alex recalls, "but at

this point, other than Tim and I and, like, my mother, no one was really pushing to get (the station) started."

Undaunted, Alex and Tim used their budget to purchase recording equipment and build a booth on campus during the first semester of their junior year.

In January 2013, they held open auditions and selected hosts and writers for the station.

Having assembled a staff, Alex and Tim thought about the best way to encourage their peers to tune in to KSHS broadcasts.

First, Alex says, to make the station seem like an integral part of life on cam-

pus, KSHS staff handed out free pizza and KSHS sweatshirts. The free shirts seem to have worked in that students unaffiliated with the station still wear them around school today.

After attracting their peers' attention, the students behind KSHS had to work to keep it.

Accessibility was a main concern. "We found that, if anyone has to take more than five seconds and two steps (to listen), they won't," Alex says. For increased ease of access, KSHS made their broadcasts available to stream on the SHP website, as well as on FM radio.

But for the KSHS staff, the most important task was producing fresh and engaging content every week. "You're not

going to get listeners if you're not talking about things your audience wants to hear," Alex points out. "You can shape the conversation and add to the dialogue, but you can't try to run against the current."

Today, SHP's administration gives KSHS staff a lot of freedom, provided that their content is tasteful and respectful. The station broadcasts six regular programs every week. These include "Girl Talk," a show on which two female hosts discuss beauty tips, dating advice, and social events on campus; a debate show that takes calls from listeners; and a variety show, which combines comedic segments and interviews with local business people and politicians.

KSHS also airs occasional live broadcasts of high-profile school sporting events, along with special panels every few weeks to allow teachers, students, and outside experts to discuss controversial topics, such as teen drug and alcohol use.

Currently, there are 27 students involved with the station, and the online broadcasts have had 1,500 unique IP address hits in the past month. "It's nice to see that the station's made a culture around it," Alex says. "Now there are people who really spend their time on the show. They've been able to make (KSHS) a part of who they are."

Every high school class at SHP is represented among KSHS's on-air hosts, and younger stu-

dents say they are grateful for the opportunities Alex and Tim have made possible. "I would never have considered radio as an option in the future," says junior host Nick York, "but now I'm thinking it might be a nice thing to do at some point."

Currently, KSHS is broadcasting online only, as the students work on acquiring a new FM frequency and move to a more powerful transmitter of around 100 watts. They've also begun releasing recorded content on a SoundCloud account. The station will go on hiatus for the summer, but the students plan to resume regular broadcasts at the start of the next academic year.

## Fashioning a fabulous framitz

Ninety-five years ago Grandfather bought the Woodside property that has brought joy to five generations of our family. When on a winter's night in 1934 the original frame house burned, my uncles quickly found an architect to rebuild the ruined structure.

We were delighted with the modern touches of tiled windowsills, beamed ceilings, and keyless rustic locks. Recently we

had occasion to be anything but thrilled with one of those locks.

Not long ago a guest took an afternoon nap on our old sleeping porch and locked the door for privacy. This is no ordinary lock. The exterior part has a kind of thumb pedal that lifts a bar on the inside to open and close the door. A small curved piece of metal flips back and forth to lock or unlock as needed.

That afternoon as he left the sleeping porch, our visitor flipped the metal piece, but alas, it did not travel all the way back

but teetered in between. When the door closed it moved forward to relock itself.

This would have presented no problem on a keyed door, but ours was different. There was no way to enter the room. We could not get in from the outside without destroying the continuous screening and at least two or three of the hinged paned windows, and perhaps breaking an arm or a leg in the process. Drilling a hole in the door was an unpleasant possibility. Because the house doors were two or

three inches thick, we tried to consider other remedies.

Several weeks passed without a solution. Ours is a family of engineers but most of them live elsewhere with other and more pressing problems than a locked door in the old homestead. I, a former Spanish teacher, kept thinking as the time passed. Finally a few ideas came.

It seemed possible to drop a wire over the top of the door and to jiggle the curlicue lock from there. No luck. The wire was too light to fall where I

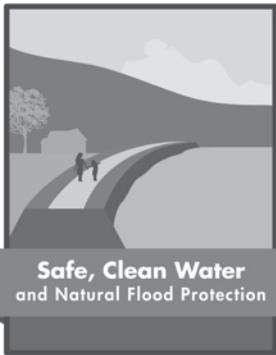
wanted it.

After more thought, it seemed to me that we could bend a wire or a metal rod to go under the door and reach up to the lock. I asked my engineer daughter-in-law if this could work.

When she agreed, I searched our tool house and found a promising piece of metal. I tried bending it in the vise — unsuccessfully, but I carried it back to the house and kept pushing it under the door and twisting it in an attempt to hit the curlicue.

That afternoon an engineer nephew arrived. I immediately

Due to the level of external funding available, staff recommends modifying the program document to advise the public of the level of flood protection that can be achieved at this time.

As stated in the Modified Project Description, the local-state-funding-only project will be the same as the preferred project downstream of Highway 101; but upstream of Highway 101, the project will remedy channel constrictions and modify bridges at Newell Road and Pope/Chaucer Street to allow the channel to contain flood waters equal to the channel's capacity of 7,000 cubic feet per second (cfs), approximately a 30-year flood event. Allowing this level of water to flow through the channel will protect approximately 3,000 parcels in Palo Alto from a flood event close to the February 1998 flood, the largest on record. Currently, the channel can only convey a 15-year flood event.

If sufficient funding becomes available, a 1 percent (100-year) flood protection project upstream of Highway 101, including some combination of: modifications to the University Avenue and Middlefield Road bridges; upstream detention; underground bypass channels; and floodwalls, could be built.



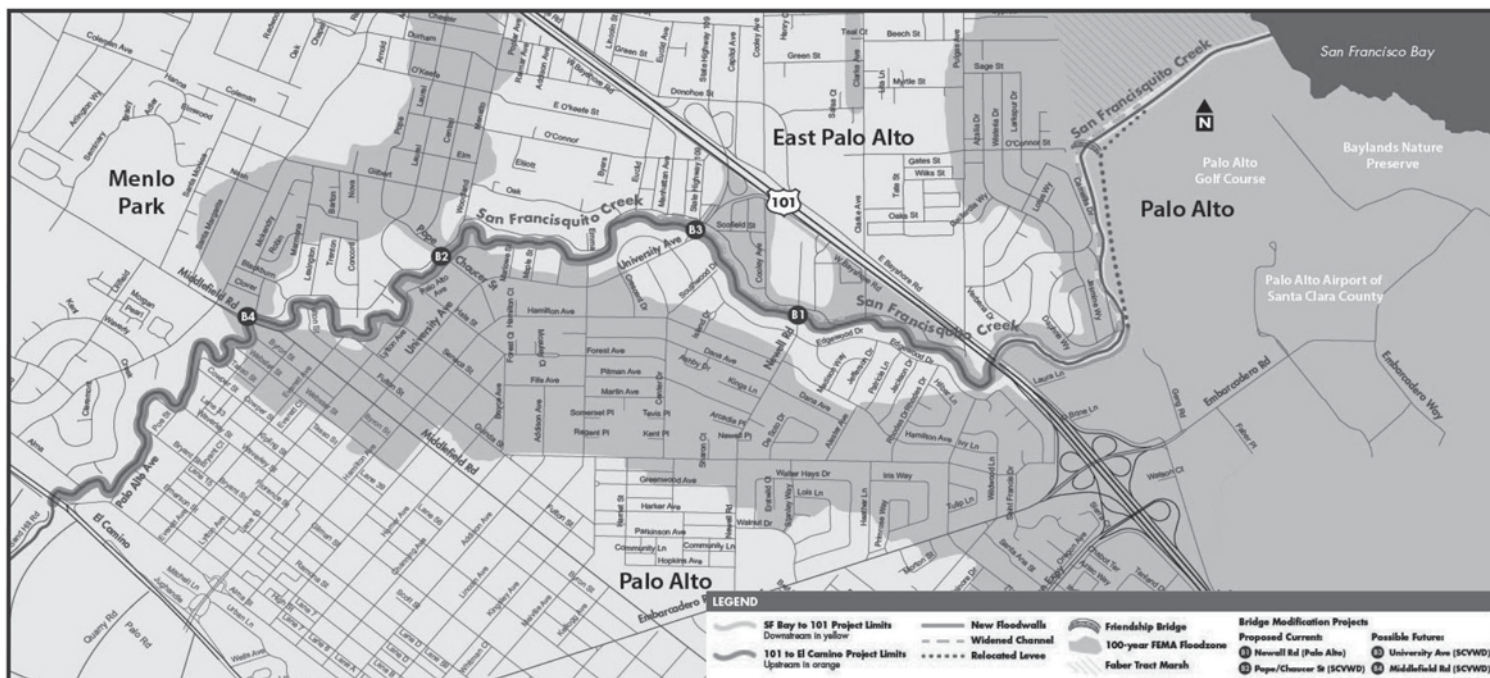
San Francisquito Creek, 1950s flood event

Proposed modifications to key performance indicators:

- 1. Preferred project with federal, state and local funding:** Protect more than 3,000 parcels by providing 1 percent flood protection.
- 2. With state and local funding only:** Protect approximately 3,000 parcels from flooding (100-year protection downstream of Highway 101, and approximately 30-year protection upstream of Highway 101).

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# Bombing survivors return to the marathon

A year after being injured in the Boston Marathon bombings, Amanda North of Woodside got to watch her daughter, Lili Pike, cross the finish line at the marathon on April 21, and they celebrated together.

On April 15, 2013, Lili was about four hours into her Boston Marathon run and near the finish line when the first bomb went off, knocking her off her feet. She was not hurt, but her mother, who was watching the race and was also knocked to the ground, received third-degree burns, a large gash on her leg and a ruptured eardrum.

In addition, Ms. North says, she was “surrounded by some of the worse casualties.” One spectator was killed and another ended up as a double amputee. Erika Brannock, a preschool teacher from the Baltimore area who lost a leg, gives Ms. North credit for helping save her life.

Now, a year later, Ms. North says her hearing is restored, and the burns and gash on her leg have healed.

“I was very, very fortunate,” she says, and now she takes “each day as a gift.”

On April 15 this year, Ms. North attended the tribute held at the Boston Convention & Exhibition Center to commemorate the three people who were killed and the more than 260 injured in the bombings.

Vice President “Joe Biden gave a very moving talk on resilience, hope and fortitude ... and you didn’t hear one survivor talk without talking about moving forward. You felt uplifted,” Ms. North says.

She learned of one family, for example, that has dealt with its loss by starting a foundation to promote stem cell research for patients with injuries.

After the ceremony, Ms. North and Ms. Brannock went out in the rain to cross the finish line. Ms. Brannock has a prosthetic leg and used a walker to cross first with her mother. Ms. North was a step behind, linking arms with her son, Logan Pike, and Lili. “That was very emotional; that brought closure,” Ms. North says.

Later, Ms. North visited the hospital where she was treated in

Dorchester. Ms. Brannock also returned to the hospital where she had spent 50 days recovering from her wounds. Ms. North describes the visit as “really joyous.”

At this year’s marathon on April 21, the sun was shining, thousands more people than usual turned out to watch the race, and police presence was high. Ms. North saw many heli-

copters flying over and barricades lining the course. “Maybe people were anxious in their hearts, but they didn’t show it,” she says.

Ms. North watched the race with friends from Woodside, Abby and Henry Wilder, who were there to see their daughter, Mary, run. She finished, and so did Lili’s running partner.

Ms. North started to get concerned when there was no sign of Lili, who had run a lot in high school, but hadn’t spent a lot of time continuing her training at Harvard. Lili injured her knee before the race, yet was determined to participate no matter what.

Turns out she spent the last 10 miles “hobbling and walking,” but when she crossed the finish line after about five hours, Ms. North says, “My heart swelled

with pride.”

Now that Ms. North is back in town, she is working on Artisans Connect, an e-commerce business she runs out of her home. Launched in April, the website sells home decorating accessories made by artisans in developing countries around the world.

Ms. North says the bombing “changed my life,” leading her to quit her high-tech marketing job and start up a social venture that’s more in keeping with the political, economic, and international focus she had back in college during the 1970s.

She likes the idea that she can “support artisans and keep them in their traditional livelihood,” so they have an opportunity to do something besides working in call centers or as tour operators. ■

## Avenidas CEO steps down

After 15 years, Menlo Park resident Lisa Hendrickson is stepping aside from her role as president and CEO of the Avenidas senior services organization in Palo Alto. The Avenidas board of directors is conducting a national search for her replacement, the organization announced May 14.
