

# Woodside Community Theatre stages 'Chicago'

After five years of waiting, Woodside Community Theatre is finally putting on "Chicago."

Co-producer Donna Losey says the local theater group kept putting in requests for the rights to do the show and was rejected year after year, probably because it was touring nationally. This time around WCT got permission and will stage the musical on six dates starting Oct. 16.

Based on real murder trials from the 1920s, "Chicago" is one of Broadway's longest running American musicals. The original Broadway show opened in 1975 with music by John Kander, lyrics and book by Fred Ebb and choreography by Bob Fosse. WCT is sticking closely to that version.

"The 1996 revival of 'Chicago' really changed a lot of the original intent," says director Stephanie Maysonave. "We're paying homage to the original vaudevillian acts ... the sex, intrigue, mystery, jazz, booze, and all that."

She is making her directorial debut with WCT two years after appearing as a showgirl in its production of "The Producers." She says she's thrilled to be directing "Chicago" because she's a "huge Bob Fosse fan" and the show "has been on my bucket list for years."

Steve Wilner gives similar reasons for why he is willing to drive all the way from Dublin to play the role of lawyer Billy Flynn. "This is a dream role," he says. "Ever since I saw the original on Broadway, it was on the bucket list."

Auditions took place in June. About half of the 70 people who

tried out landed parts. No one is paid. For everyone participating in the group's annual show, it's on his or her own dime and time.

Rehearsals are taking place at Hillview Middle School, where cast member Richard Vaughan teaches music, and in San Carlos, where choreographer Kim Harvath has a dance studio.

The actress playing Roxie, Arielle Rothman, has an easy commute on the San Carlos days because she lives there. With her professional background in writing, recording and performing music, she feels she is bringing a different dimension to her part.

"Roxie is normally a dancer," she says. "We chose to go with a singer who can move."

Audience members may remember Ms. Rothman when she played the leads in Woodside School's eighth-grade operetta "Annie" and in Woodside High's "The Wiz."

Appearing in the other major roles in "Chicago" are Adrienne Herro as Velma, Mike Fatum as Amos, and Marisol Urbano as Mama Morton.

is alive and well at WCT both on and off the stage.

The choreographer went to school there and so did three of the cast members she is teaching dance moves to: Cheryl Ringman, Adrian Contreras and Leslie Chocano.

Current Woodside High students Cella Hussussian and Stephen Rodondi are in the ensemble, too, alongside former Woodside High parent John Tondino.

Former Woodside High parents working behind the scenes include: Nancy Krosse as assis-

tant stage manager (she played the lead in WCT's "Curtains" last year), Karen Patrick and Lyndesay Adams on costumes, Tina Patrick as head painter, Deborah Rosas on properties, Mary Ann Draeger on publicity, Marsha BonDurant on the program, Darrell Batchelder on the program and marketing, Steve Patrick as chief builder, and Akio Patrick as set designer and technical director.

Former Woodside High parent Donna Losey is co-producing with Mark Bowles and Liz Matchett. They originally met

at Woodside School.

Former Woodsiders are involved, too. Mr. Bowles' son, Ben, is the sound operator and Fletcher Johnson is back running the computerized rigging system for scenery and curtains.

Don Coluzzi of Portola Valley is returning to head up lighting, assisted again by Joan Rubin of Woodside.

Woodside resident Richard Gordon is back as music director, conducting a live orchestra of 14. The set will be divided into two levels with the band playing on stage rather than in a pit. ■

# Study: Lyme disease infected ticks found in 'all kinds of habitats'

A study funded by the Portola Valley-based non-profit Bay Area Lyme Foundation found the bacteria that cause Lyme disease "in every place we looked" in this region, according to Executive Director Linda Giampa.

The Public Library of Science just released the results online.

In May of 2013 researchers from Stanford and Northern Arizona universities led an effort to collect Western black-legged ticks, the tick that transmits Lyme to people on the West Coast.

They dragged flannel blankets on and around trails in 20 parks and open spaces extending from Sonoma to Santa Cruz counties, caught and then tested 349 nymphs and 273 adults.

Out of all the sites sampled

Ms. Giampa said, Windy Hill Open Space Preserve had a "slightly, slightly higher percentage" of infected nymphs.

She hikes Windy Hill with her dog often and isn't all that worried about the threat of Lyme disease because, she said, compared to the East Coast, this study shows "overall it's a low percentage of ticks carrying the bacteria, about five out of every 100 nymphs."

The infected nymphs were found in the coast live oak woodland and Douglas fir parts of the preserve, whereas at nearby Thornewood Open Space Preserve, some infected nymphs turned up in coast live oak forest and then, to a lesser degree, in redwood forest.

Ms. Giampa said that's one of the surprising parts about the study, discovering that infected ticks exist in all kinds of differ-

ent habitats.

Tick season is year-round in California, but since ticks like moisture, she said, the good news is "in a drought there are currently less ticks in the area than in the past."

Another surprise researchers found is that a strain of bacteria that has caused tick-borne relapsing fever on the East Coast

# Is it something in the water?

What are the odds? The Almanac recently reported that an Atherton City Council member had swum from Alcatraz to Aquatic Park. It turns out he had coaching from another council member who is a veteran open-water swimmer, Mike Lempres.

Mr. Lempres, who was elected to the five-member Atherton council in November 2014, says

he has been doing open-water swims since he was a middle-schooler.

He took a break for a number of years, but “when I returned from (Washington) D.C. about six years ago, I picked it up in earnest,” he says.

Mr. Lempres says he has swum from AT&T Park to Aquatic Park, across the Golden Gate; and Angel Island to Tiburon. He has also done several Alcatraz swims — including one in December with the water just

over 50 degrees, without a wetsuit. In warmer water, his adventures include swims in Southern California, Hawaii, Texas and in several lakes.

Mr. Lempres says open-water swimming is a great activity. “It’s adventurous and fun and far less damaging on my joints than running,” he says. “The best part is the camaraderie. I swim with the same guys every Saturday morning and we all have breakfast together afterwards.”

He usually swims without a wetsuit, and his best time from Alcatraz is slightly under 30 minutes.

Why does he do it? Mr. Lempres says even his family asks that question. “It’s kind of crazy, particularly in the winter when we swim in the early morning dark and the cold,” without wetsuits, he says, adding, “but I love it.”

Mr. Lempres says the swims have “become important to me” for the sense of adventure, but also “the connection I feel to the Bay Area and its history while I’m swimming. My grandfather swam in the same water, and it’s one thing that hasn’t changed much since he was young.”

Most of all, he says, “I enjoy the sense of camaraderie and kinship with the other foolish people who are out there with me.”

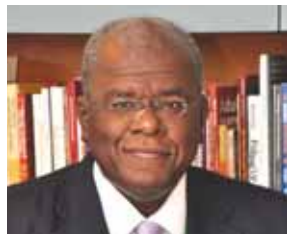

and in Europe, has now moved into the Bay Area in increasing numbers.

On this coast, Western gray squirrels and dusky-footed wood rats are the most common carriers of the bacteria that cause Lyme disease. When a tick bites a host animal and then latches onto a person, the disease can be passed along. The longer the tick is attached to the person, the higher the chance of transmission.

Ms. Giampa encourages everyone to take preventative measures and be vigilant when outdoors. She suggests wearing protective clothing and checking for ticks periodically and thoroughly. Nymphs are particularly easy to miss because they are the size of a poppy seed.

Lyme disease can be treated with antibiotics. Without treatment, symptoms can develop over time and range from headaches to swollen joints and neurological problems.

“Anecdotally, we think (Lyme disease) does affect people differently, and, anecdotally, we think some people have an immunity to ticks,” Ms. Giampa said, adding that the varying responses may have something to do with the genetically diverse variety of both the bacteria and people involved.

Right now, the Bay Area Lyme Foundation is supporting a study to find out why some people are “tick magnets.” Another study is in the works to collect and compare ticks all over the country.

Farewell to Fosters Freeze

The farewell celebration for Fosters Freeze on Sept. 30 attracted no less than a marching band, a TV crew, and a crowd of people substantial enough to consume the entirety of the shop's remaining ice cream supply within an hour.

Fosters Freeze first opened in Menlo Park in 1949, according to the Menlo Park Historical Association, and closed its service windows to customers for the last time at approximately 7:30 p.m. Wednesday evening, Sept. 30, when the last of the hamburger buns in stock had been served.

Fosters Freeze, located at 580 Oak Grove Ave., about half a block east of El Camino

Real, had been a "home away from home" for his two sons, said Doug Anderson, an organizer of the Los Trancos Woods Marching Band. He reached out to other members of the band and successfully gathered 18 performers, who played at the farewell.

Even after the ice cream ran out, visitors waited in line just to say their goodbyes to the Lee family, the owners of the shop. Large pieces of poster paper taped to the wall of the building were quickly filled with colorful "Thank yous" and notes of appreciation for the Lees.

The party was organized by Menlo Park resident Laurie Gallagher, who in 2006 circulated a petition with her two sons to save Fosters Freeze when it was then threatened by

development plans. The petition garnered 1,000 signatures, she said. When the Lees put up the sign several weeks ago that they would be closing the store, she wanted to do something special to say goodbye.

"(The Lees) have been so wonderful and we're so grateful to them for keeping it going for 30 years," she said. "I couldn't let it go without giving it the send-off it deserves."

According to one of Ms. Gallagher's sons, Brady Gallagher, who at age 13 gathered signatures for the petition to save Fosters Freeze in 2006, "Menlo Park is becoming this ridiculous place where no one can afford to run a small business."

"There'll never be another Fosters or anything like it in Menlo Park," he said.
